He does not impart knowledge to him, he shows him how to acquire knowledge for himself. He does not call forth the knowledge that is within; he only shows him where it lies and how it can be habituated to rise to the surface. The distinction that reserves this principle for the teaching of adolescent and adult minds and denies its application to the child, is a conservative and unintelligent doctrine.

Finally, the whole universe is composed of a single substance of divine Consciousness-Force, and Agni is the element of force or energy in consciousness: "O Son of Energy," says the Rig Veda. (VIII.84.4) It is Force-Consciousness, a warmth, a flame, at whatever level we feel it. When we concentrate in our mind, we feel the subtle heat of mental energy or mental Agni; when we concentrate in our heart or in our emotions, we feel the subtle heat of Life-Energy or vital Agni; when we plunge into our soul, we experience the soul's subtle heat or psychic Agni. There is only one Agni throughout, one current of consciousness-energy Consciousness-Force or or consciousness-heat taking on different intensities at different levels. Then there is the fundamental Agni, or material Agni, which is the ultimate state of the energy of consciousness, prior to its conversion or densification into Matter. This is how one becomes the other. (Let us here recalled the Mother's words: "It is a movement greater than the force or power holding the cells in an individual form.") Modern science has also finally realized that Matter and Energy can be converted into each other (E = mc2 is its great breakthrough), but it has yet to see that Energy is consciousness, that Matter is consciousness, and that by acting upon consciousness one can act upon Energy and Matter. To transform Matter into Energy, modern science knows only of physical processes that produce heat, but by knowing the fundamental Agni, which is the foundation of Energy or Consciousness-Force, one can, in principle, act directly upon Matter and achieve the same transmutation without setting one's body on fire in the process.

The conversation of 1926 then introduces us to two material facts (and their spiritual basis) that are extremely important from the standpoint of transformation: first, that all earthly forms are made up of the same elements, and only different atomic arrangements account for the different features (this is the physical counterpart to the spiritual truth of the world's divine Oneness: "Thou art man and woman, boy and girl, old and worn thou walkest bent over a staff; thou art the blue bird and the green and the scarlet-eyed"); 360 and second, that the solar fire in Matter is the material counterpart of the fundamental *Agni*, which, as Sri Aurobindo stressed in another part of the same conversation, is the builder of forms. To wield Agni is to be able to change forms, to transform Matter: "He tastes not that delight (of the twice-born) who is unripe and whose body has not suffered in the heat of the fire," says the Rig Veda; "they alone are able to bear that and enjoy it who have been prepared by the flame." (IX.83.1) It is the warm gold dust that will transmute its material counterpart, the nuclear dust in our body: The subtle process will be more powerful than the gross, so that a subtle action of Agni will be able to do the action which would now need a physical change such as increased temperature. Our atoms too are merely a convenient translation of the eternal ritual; nothing is fixed or inevitable. There is no end to the possible combinations, no end to the new human Being.

SECOND PHASE - THE BODY

The second phase began in 1926 and continued until 1940. It was a phase of individual work on the body and in the subconscient. Up to this point, we have all the clues to achieve the supramental change of consciousness ourselves, and we know the basic principle of transformation. It is Agni "who does the work," says the Rig Veda. (I.1.5) But how, practically, is *Agni* going to change Matter? We cannot yet say; we know only some bits here and there. If we knew the process, says the Mother, it would already be done. All the other realizations have been meticulously recorded by the Indian traditions; we know all the methods for attaining Nirvana; realizing the cosmic Spirit; finding the soul; conquering gravity, hunger, cold, sleep and illnesses; leaving one's body at will; or prolonging life. Everyone can achieve these feats; the way is well charted, and the stages have been described by the seers or the Hindu shastras for thousands of years. It is merely a question of and patience and timing. the discipline proper But transformation is something no one has ever done, an entirely unknown journey, like traveling through a country that does not yet exist. Perhaps it is something equivalent to what happened when the first mental forms began to emerge in the world of Matter and Life. How could the first semi-animal organism that received these mental vibrations understand and describe what was happening to it, and, above all, how could it say what had to be done to control thought? To quote the Mother: You don't know whether this or that experience is part of the way or not; you don't even know if you are progressing or not, because if you knew you were progressing, it would mean that you knew the way - but there is no way! No one has ever been there! We won't really be able to say what it is until it has been done. It is an adventure into the unknown, as Sri Aurobindo would emphasize. We are truly like the old primates before this new creation. From here on, therefore, we can only indicate some broad lines of development, or of difficulty, without being sure whether or not they really belong to the path. The experience is in process. When it has succeeded once, just once, in a single human being, then the very conditions of the transformation will be different, because the path will have been trodden, charted, and the prime difficulties cleared away. The day Plato conceived Phaedrus, he raised up all of humankind to the possibility of Phaedrus. The day a single human being overcomes the difficulties of the transformation, he will raise up all humanity to the possibility of a luminous, immortal, true life.



OPEN LETTER FROM THE RA WCOM: UPHOLDING THE AUROVILLE WE LOVE

Dear residents,

It's been over a year since you selected us to be your representatives. Much has happened since then: the courts have been approached, the takeovers have continued, and the situation has reached unprecedented intensities. We are exhausted and pained by the state of affairs Auroville is going through; but we continue to stand on a daily basis for a greater purpose, that of Auroville's realisation as envisioned by the Mother. We are proud and grateful to be representing the Auroville community - and its unique set of diversities, its land of experimentation and innovation, its fertile playground for the advent of a new consciousness.

We are well aware that there is fear circulating among many, sometimes even despair, and that much hope is projected on the outcome of our court cases. We share this hope and pray that we can announce good news soon, keeping in mind that the legal route is often long and made of ups and downs. However, we must emphasize that the courts cannot build the Auroville of tomorrow. Some could believe that the Secretary's intimidation approach has been horrendously effective; but on the other hand, even today while being targeted with legal consequences, cutting of funds or expulsion threats, many of us remain committed to standing for Auroville's purpose and mission of Unity in Diversity. Alone we are only raindrops, but together we can form a river of souls, united by the same quest and the same thirst for a new reality.

So here is our request to all: let us remain faithful, despite the waves of despair and anguish that come our way. Let us remain active and courageous, for what is really asked from us in these times of uncertainty is to fully embody the ideals for which we have dedicated our lives, the values and ideals of Auroville, so that they may continue to be manifested upon Earth.

Every action matters: documenting the wrongdoings of the Secretary's office and appointees and keeping the RA working groups informed, standing as quiet witness to ongoing destruction, sharing one's perspectives in the RA News&Notes, initiating and signing petitions and statements, supporting working groups with their many tasks and responsibilities, coordinating emergency responses to the continued takeovers, taking part in conversations about building tomorrow's Auroville, supporting financially those who have been targeted with a maintenance or budget cut, encouraging those who stand on the front line, finding creative new ways to explore Auroville's resilience and future... So much can be done if we are together!

Let us keep praying, let us keep acting. This is also our Karma yoga.

FROM THE AV COUNCIL

GOODWILL RESTORATION SERVICE HUB

Dear Community,

For many years now, and before the creation of Koodam in 2015, there has been a gap in our organisation in regards to effective and responsible conflict resolution. We have always tried to handle internal conflicts or even transgressions in Auroville ourselves before going to outside agencies. This has allowed our community to grow more organically but it has also presented us with some complex challenges.

The Auroville Council is often seen as a conflict resolution body amongst other things. With the creation of Koodam and the application of the Conflict Resolution Policy in 2015 the Council had started a new chapter that encouraged restorative justice and reconciliation. The Auroville Council with the support and advice of Koodam made many strides in our community conflict resolution culture, offering processes of mediation, restorative circles, arbitrations and appeals against Working Group decisions etc.

With the dissolution of Koodam in July 2021, the Arbitration Coordination Group and Facilitator Coordination Group were created to support the Auroville Council to continue overseeing the framework that the Conflict Resolution Policy had put in place. In order to do this more effectively, the Council formed a subgroup called the Conflict Resolution Council (CRC) to cover the administrative and coordination work which the Council was already doing. This initiative began well and continues, although the situation in Auroville over the past 2 years has made it very difficult to develop and to offer a holistic service.

The Auroville Council has several important roles to fulfil for the Residents' Assembly, and these have all suffered due to the additional load of needing to be a conflict resolution body. The development of our internal mechanisms and policies, the convening of regular GMs and our many other responsibilities require a lot of time, dedication and care. If these widely varying areas of work, which require very different skill sets, are further clubbed together with conflict resolution, all will suffer.

Therefore, the Auroville Council proposes to create a new independent service for Auroville, tentatively called the Goodwill Restoration Service Hub (GRSH). The GRSH would be answerable directly to the RA and it would take over all aspects of conflict resolution that the Auroville Council has so far been responsible for as per the Conflict Resolution Policy 2015. The full role of GRSH is yet to be determined by the RA itself but we envision that as well as providing support for interpersonal conflict resolution and holding appeals against working group decisions. We propose that a mandate be prepared for GRSH.

There are still several steps before the GRSH can be fully realised. As of now the CRC team as a subgroup of the Auroville Council covers this general role but hopefully you will hear from us on this topic soon. Various Council Topics

Several Council members took time off for the summer, so many of our meetings were not well attended but the work went on.

Selection Process and tentative timeline

The Council met with the Residents Assembly Service and have discussed the upcoming Selection process with them. We are still working on incorporating the feedback received for the PWG Selection Process and we may also hold a GM on the same to encourage participation.

Aurovilian postings on Auronet removed - this was a very valuable reference of Mother's commentary on the physical development of Auroville which was deleted by individuals who have been put in place without due process by the Office of the Auroville Foundation.

A member of the community brought a concern that one of their confidential emails was leaked from the Council. After an internal investigation it was determined that this was due to an oversight by a Council member.

RAS membership resolution - On the 5th of May, a resolution was passed to appoint the new RAS members.

Allocation of housing assets

Campaign to gather up-to-date email addresses. AVC and RAS have been in discussion of how to best gather up-to-date email addresses for communication and RA processes.

Mandates and Policies

Entry Policy: Council together with the Entry Board are in the process of reviewing the mandate to see where improvements could be made.

RAS mandate: Following up on the work done by a subgroup of the Council in 2022, the Council has prepared a draft for a new RAS mandate. We intend to do the same with the Council mandate so that they complement each other. We will update the community as and when we are ready.

The Selection Process Review Task Force (SPRTF): The subgroup shared two reports with the Council. The Council members are now working to harmonise the varying recommendations in order to finalise the review at the earliest.

RAD policy and Citizens Assembly (CA): Council was planning on holding a community survey to gather input on a possible way forward for developing the new RAD policy. Presently this topic is paused as many other topics have taken precedence.

Two Council members are available to receive residents to listen to any matters or topics that may be impacting them, which they may wish to bring to the Council table for discussion.

Only finalised mediations will be mentioned anonymously. Arbitration and appeal processes however, will be announced upon start and completion, also in a general manner only.

OPEN LETTER TO THE AFO FAMC AND FARM SERVICE FROM THE AUROVILLE FARM GROUP

Dear members of FAMC and Farm Service

We are taken aback by your request to Ayarpadi Farm to give up 5 acres of their cultivated land to be used by volunteers to explore a farming future.

We are happy to welcome new farmers in Auroville, but the way you go about this is very disturbing.

We think it is important to understand that farms are not just fields, but carefully set up entities where different parts and activities become a functioning organism where all parts play a crucial role. Cutting off a part of a farm as a whole from one day to the other has a dramatic effect on the farm. Farm economics are very tight and over the years a farmer finetunes the different farm parts to be able to manage logistics properly and make the economics of the farm work.

We wonder why you want to take a part of a good functioning farm to experiment with. Ayarpadi has been consistently producing field crops on this part of their farm. The farm is a main producer of grains like paddy, peanuts, ragi and sesame. These crops are all in short supply in Auroville and need skill to produce. Since many years, every year, crops have been produced on this particular plot of land. This plot is delivering around 4 tons of grain crops every year consistently which after processing end up in solar kitchen and PTDC. Ayarpadi is our main producer of boiled rice in Solar kitchen and a good amount comes from this particular plot.

Farming is a very demanding occupation and one needs many years to acquire the skill set and patience to succeed. A half year of training as you are offering gives at best a short exposure to the world of agriculture. It would be very wise to let those volunteers join an existing farm of their choice for a few years and learn farming in our challenging reality. After which they can be allocated land to farm on their own.

A very big part of setting up and running a farm in Auroville is setting up infrastructure. Ayarpadi Farm has spent a lot of their energy/money making this plot of land into a productive land parcel. To just grab this land away from the rest of the farm without any dialogue and discussion is simply not acceptable.

There are many land plots(5-6 acres in Rajapudupakkam, 17 acres in Irumbai)in Auroville which need protection and can be made productive. If you think that the volunteers are ready to become farmers please allocate some of those lands to them and assist them to put in the needed infra to be able to start growing food for the community.

There might be farms who have areas to be developed and might be happy to welcome newcomer farmers to develop the existing farms to become more productive.

The farm group is open for a healthy dialogue whenever you want to talk about developing farms in Auroville.

VACCINATION CAMPAIGN UPDATE

We would like to provide an update on our ongoing vaccination campaign in response to the mass outbreak of Canine Distemper. Thanks to the community's response, we have made significant progress in safeguarding our beloved dogs against this deadly virus.



Over the past two weeks, our dedicated mobile vet and vet technician team have successfully vaccinated 41 dogs using Dhppi Novibac 5-in-1 vaccine, which provides protection against Rabies, Canine Distemper, Parvo, and other viruses.

Our team has been actively visiting various areas, including Pour Tous, Adventure, Ganesh Bakery, Matrimandir, Shanti Community, Tollgate area, Realisation, Swayam, Edyanchavadi, Kottakarai, Last School, and GP Cafe, among others. While we have observed a decrease in the number of reported Canine Distemper cases, it is important to note that the mass outbreak is not yet fully over. We strongly urge those who have not yet vaccinated their dogs and pets to do so promptly in order to safeguard them from this dangerous virus. Vaccinations should be administered by a licensed veterinarian or certified vet technician only to ensure that they are in compliance with legal requirements and to guarantee the health and well-being of your beloved pets.

Art from any society is the reflection of the health, value systems and the governance of the society. I have always felt that Art can make a huge impact on the controlling regime by its beauty, expression, dissent and the innovative ways one can express through Art.

Here is my mail for your food for thought, when you make your new art works from now on.

It's time to change, Act, Come to support and raise your voice as an artist through your work.

Dear Saumya, Supriya and Team,

I have read your recent note of expression in the news & notes AVF edition.

Though it is clear from your note, where you justify your position and appointment, I have a few queries, and hence this note. I do hope that I will get an honest answer to this, as honest as your note.

As an artist, curator who has worked, established Kala Kendra and experience with several artists of Auroville, here are my concerns, which I hope you will address or clarify.

- These appointments are done without any consultation with any of the existing artists groups, services or others, purely on an arbitrary basis. Do you think this is the process, the City in making as Auroville, can justify as its Governance system?
- I am one of the artists, whose few expressions, installations, have been brutally removed, criticized by a section of people, who support your appointments; and vilified for being expressive through art installations, in public realm. Do you think this is justified for a community of artists, who represent a future, progressive outlook to the Art in Auroville?
- I know you may not have the intentions or an authority, being new to this administrative job. However, Is there a policy statement, vision of future development or inclusive and progressive, innovative way of Art Expression that you new executives of Art Service appointed by AV Foundation have worked on? Can you share this vision with the Art Community of Auroville?

- Several of us artists, who are active and connected with the Artists Community of India, and abroad, feel that Auroville's present situation is much more beyond your simplistic expression and understanding. We would like to know on what basis, with what policy or regulations, are you planning to integrate us all with the new regime? A regime which has consistently demonstrated that Community of Auroville is incapable of a governance system, that is democratic, consensus oriented and forward looking to nurture the art scene for a City of the Future. We would like to know a clear statement that demonstrates that you are not a simple tool of oppression and control of the Art Expression of Auroville Artists.
- I have personally known some of you for quite sometime, may be not so much personally. Your appointment and acceptance of this position, in violation of all principles of normal justice, did come as a surprise, pushing us all to resist, not cooperate or to ignore your new positions; You represent the force with which the Auroville Community has been crushed under the weight of a small group of Aurovilians who have taken a more fanatic path to development and vision of Auroville. Do you think this is the way forward to any sort of Human Unity, future you envision; including for Art of Auroville?
- You may disagree to some of my use of phrases, expression here, however, you are all wise enough to understand that Art has never been controled by such regimes, In fact, it flowers and flourishes under such controlled regimes. I do hope that your building blocks of the new bridges you talk about is in fact built by new foundations, vision and the freedom of expression of the Auroville Artists, whether or not they join your team or function as independent Artists, or under other umbrellas within the country or elsewhere. I would like to know your view point, clearly on how are you able to allow Artists, art services and their own way of expression, when they do not join your side of the divide, we are seeing so prevalent in Auroville. Kindly express clearly on the same.
- Last but not the least, I do hope that you will honestly reply to this, promptly as an artist or an administrator, who will be showing us a goodwill, generosity to exist in our freedom within the Community of Artists, and not force us, exclude or intimidate us with your policies, rules and regulations that originate from a very cultish, fanatic Auroville Vision much narrower than the Charter or the Indian Constitution or the Master Plan, whatever it is. I hope that you will not hinder upon our path of expression and existence, in coming months and force us to exit the art scence or find our own path ahead. We hope to have clear answers that reflect your urge to build bridges, rather than see us as the other and celebrate our right to dissent from your AV Art Service.

I have seen many such attempts earlier from similar groups in last 30 years of my Auroville life and I openly would like to defy your orders to join your art service, or be bowed down by the new regime, as an artist, as an Indian, as a community member. Would you be able to take the same attitude and let us exist with whichever group we decide to be with and celebrate our dissent? As an artist I feel my freedom of expression is paramount to me, beyond the emotional outbursts and justifications of burning or building the bridges. As an artist community, Auroville Artists should be just let be, rather than being penalised for choosing to go with the Dream of the The Mother, and not toe the line of the forces that have appointed you as their AV Arts Service.

I do hope to get clear and to the point answers so that I can exist inspite of any of the forced agendas of the regime supported by your neutral or sided positions. I wait for your answer.

MOTHER'S TOWN IS THE MANIFESTATION OF THE COLLECTIVE PSYCHIC BEING TAKING THE LEAD

Mother's Auroville is an economically self-sufficient town providing all that's needed for the residents' daily life, including the construction and repair materials. There is no money circulation and only the surplus is sold outside. There is no private property and no private profits, everything goes to the Central Fund for the wellbeing of all. If people are taken in charge by Auroville, they work full time and have no pensions or other incomes. There are no servants, no paid workers. Certainly, there are no cars; only collective transport and electric vehicles at a maximum speed of 15 kms by the hour cross the city - all others stop in large parking outside the green belt encircling Auroville as a buffer zone. The futuristic perspective of Mother's architect went as far as envisaging mobile sidewalks for pedestrians, and driverless electronic capsules, underground, for speed traffic and heavy loads – over five decades ago! The streets, flanked by porches, with square and fountains and sudden outbursts of light, are to nurture human encounters as in the beautiful towns of old. Parks and gardens and greenery adorn the city, enlivening even the economic zone that, radiating a sense of beauty and wellbeing as much as all other sectors, hosts ateliers and cottage industries. Industrial activities and farming are carried on outside the urban area. In this model city, anticipating for decades how avantgarde towns and districts are planned today, singles live in 30 square metres flats plus the collective spaces, and a family of four in 75 square metres. Serenely organised so as to maximize productivity while fostering inner concentration, everything is at a walking distance. Harmony radiates from within to without: the town is the material manifestation of the collective psychic being taking the lead, Auroville's group-soul and Mother's town are indissolubly one. It is the aspiration and prayer and joyous self-offering of the inhabitants that make Their town reality. For Auroville is "the Avatar's model town", linked to the supramental manifestation the Mother first talked about in 1930; Her city as inward state of being is the sahaja, natural, effortless way.

These were my findings in the eighties, distributed to the whole community as stencilled compilations, along with the Auroville News, on behalf of the Auroville Development Scheme. We also organised exhibitions on Mother's town and Matrimandir and were the reference point, in the Bharat Nivas compound, welcoming anyone to come and interact – but always stressing that the journey commences with Mother's guidelines: her town implies the sattwic lifestyle she set for Auroville. "To be a true Aurovilian" is the starting point: psychic to the front.

And Roger came back, after an eight-years self-exile. A throve of most precious documents, from Roger to Suresh Hindocha (Galaxy via systems engineering) to Oscar (the complete Auroville Gazette and photographic archive) and relevant others was our daily feast.

It is on this ground that I first met Kireet Joshi, in Chennai; when I told him my name he held long time my hand, looking into each other eyes, the beginning of years-long sharing, since 1985 when I left Pondicherry for Auroville. First as a member of the Laboratory of Evolution (Integral Yoga) and the Auroville Development Scheme (research and publication on Mother's guidelines for Auroville, the town and Matrimandir), both instituted by Kireet and funded by the GOI; Bhaga run the place. Afterwards as an independent researcher, author and photographer. Over the years I have been sharing views with Kiret on education and culture, Auroville, Yoga; sometimes discussing delicate questions while having lunch with Mohini Dadlani, Kireet's former philosophy student who preceded him in becoming an ashramite, and my confident. Research, publication, exhibitions on Mother's town and guidelines – alongside Integral Yoga; all are indissolubly linked – are my svadharma. Mother's guidelines in particular have been the object of two of my books. <u>"The Auroville Foundation Act and the Mother's guidelines"</u>, which I published in 2005 on the invitation of the then Secretary to the Governing Board Shri Sharma, who wrote the legal sentences in the first chapter, dedicated to the Act. The archival material and the historical narrative in that chapter were provided by gen. Krishna Tewari, a war-hero who took Auroville's defence during those troubled years, and the founder of the Auroville Archives. This book, now out of print, was listed for years in the Auroville Foundation website and routinely given to the Governing Board members. Kireet Joshi was the first one who received it, and I gave the last copy to the present Secretary Dr. J. Ravi.

The other book, <u>"The New Being and the New Society"</u>, is an enlarged version of the previous one minus the chapter on the Auroville Foundation Act, a too sensitive subject for public divulgation. As with their predecessors, I also gave a copy to the Secretary Dr. J. Ravi, shortly after she took office, and forwarded one as well to the new Chairman, Dr. R. N. Ravi. When SAIIER published the book, in 2012, with a GOI grant, I was contacted by the editor of "Mother India" (the Sri Aurobindo Ashram's monthly magazine) to get permission to reproduce, in chapters, the book.

This came to me as no surprise, for the Ashram Prosperity and the Auroville Prosperity are indeed one. And so is the summit, and at the Ashram too the quest is collective. But the supramental society that only gnostic beings make true is Auroville's can specificity, and there are no shortcuts - and no counterfeits.

We have a long way to go, ahead!

A SUMMARY OF EVENTS HAPPENING IN AUROVILLE TODAY

FARM MAINTENANCES CUT

The AVFO 'FAMC' cut maintenances to the Farms via <u>an email</u> sent to their own newly appointed 'Farm Service', without reaching out to farmers themselves.

According to a <u>massbulletin</u> released on 4th July by the RA BCC, "all Maintenances previously allocated – whether half or full – have been reduced to a care package, which is the equivalent of a quarter Maintenance". This now effectively turns all farms into commercial units instead of services as farmers will have to generate their own income. This goes against the recommendations made by the Aurovilians involved in the <u>community budgeting process</u> organised by the BCCin early 2022. The RA BCC highlighted that "Farms/Food and Social Support (Maintenances) were amongst the highest budgetary priority areas, to receive more financial support from the City Services budget if needed/possible."

In the same massbulletin, the RA BCC noted that "So far, a total of 121 adult Aurovilians have seen their Maintenance support cut by the FO FAMC and BCC, amounting to 13.6% of the Aurovilians supported by a City Services Maintenance". They added: "This is the first occasion at which Childrens' Maintenances have been cut as well – despite the fact that the RA FAMC and RA BCC had amended the Childrens' Maintenance guidelines in October 2021, making all children eligible for this support regardless of the Maintenance status of their parents."

The Farm Group has sent a response to the situation, in which they note the fallacies in thinking that the current way forward of the AVFO 'FAMC' and Farm Service will lead to more food security in Auroville, and that "anyone with a little sense of reality will realize that all these measures are surely not going to help to increase food for Aurovilians." FOREST BUDGET AND MAINTENANCES CUT

The Forest Group updated the community on the recent budget cuts via an announcement (*see below*). It has since been confirmed that Chandresh and Torkil of the AVFO 'FAMC' have cut the maintenances and salaries of forest workers of the entire Forest Group, impacting 44 people on maintenance and about 60 workers. More than a hundred people are now without an income with only a week's notice.

Forest Group update Report 3rd July 2023

The FG would like to inform the community that they are very disappointed and distressed at community members Chandresh and Torkil, and the GB FAMC for supporting them, in their recent communication and action. After withholding the Forest Budget, which supports 60 employees from our neighbouring communities, this communication states that their budget has been suspended. It also states that over 40 Aurovilian personal maintenances(some full/some part-time) will also be stopped at short notice. It should be noted that some of these Aurovilians have dedicated their whole working life to protecting and developing land for Auroville. For transparency, please read carefully the mail they sent to a few members of the FG and the FG's reply. We are really hoping for community support to ensure this callous action is reversed. The Forest Group met with the Secretary and several members of the AVFO 'FAMC' on Friday 7th July, however the AVFO groups are unwilling to restart the maintenances and budget. It is unclear now what will be done about the gratuity (a form of severance) that the workers have a legal right to.

The Forest Group shared a <u>report</u> of its work and income and expenditures for the last decades. The report shows that the city budget only partly accounts for forest expenditures, as many foresters have been covering costs out of pocket or through the sale of forest products, such as timber. The report also details the impact of Auroville's forests, and the daily work done for its protection and upkeep.

MORE AUROVILIANS IN VISA TROUBLE

An increasing number of Aurovilians are receiving recommendation letters from the AVFO that state that they are obstructing development or engaged in anti-government activities. Ongoing cases have been referred to Delhi.

UPDATE ON SATPREM'S VISA SITUATION

The <u>collective letter</u> in support of Satprem was signed by over 2700 individuals, including about 900 Aurovilians. Additionally, around 150 individual messages and appeals from around India and the world were sent to various ministries and are still coming in.

GUEST HOUSES ORDERED TO STOP TAKING RESERVATIONS

In <u>an email</u> sent on 8th July 2023, two of the team members newly appointed by the AVFO to manage Auroville's guest houses demanded that managers hand over their reservations list and immediately cease to take bookings. The reason given was for the "restructuring" of the hospitality sector in Auroville which would see guest houses split into two categories - "high quality" accommodation which would be restructured into a centrally managed "Auroville Hotel Chain", and "budget accommodation" which would be used to house volunteers and long term guests.

As many guest houses rely on last minute reservations, particularly in the summer, preventing them from taking bookings could create immediate financial problems. There hasn't been any indication on whether financial support will be given to those Aurovilians who may lose their source of income.

KALABHUMI WELL ISSUE

On 5th May 2023, the residents of Kalabhumi community received an <u>email from Lieve Claes</u> on behalf of the AVFO 'ATDC' stating that the borewell in front of the community supplying water to Kalabhumi, Existence, CRIPA, Music Studio, Aurofilm, and Dehashakti will be closed for the Crown construction. They were told that well users will be shifted to a centralised water distribution system under Auroville Water Service (AWS). On 13th May, <u>the well users responded</u> with the request for plans for the Crown, trajectory, alignment, width, work timelines, Right of Way, etc. noting that the well is located between private lands on both sides, and seeking information about expert supervision, as vague markings indicate concrete stormwater channels atop the well, which raises serious concerns about aquifer contamination. They also sought to understand the costs the residents were being asked to incur due to the disruption, as previously, the well users had paid for maintenance of the water system and had access to free water.

Meanwhile, meetings were held with AWS to understand the best way forward. <u>The AVFO 'ATDC' responded on 6th June</u> stating: "The detailed plans for the Crown are not meant for scrutiny by the residents of Auroville" and "it is important the residents understand that they are not dealing here with multiple choices". As for costs, it was stated that they would seek financial support from Gol for the main water lines, but the cost of installations etc. shall be borne by the residents. This is estimated at Rs.30,000 per household, excluding monthly costs.

On 13th June, a <u>legal notice</u> was served to the AVFO and its 'ATDC' to halt development in the area, citing multiple issues with the development. On 15th and 16th June, AWS began to dig in front of Kalabhumi gate, and the CPWD arrived with a JCB to clear space for the channels. The residents showed the senior engineer and the site manager the legal notice. The site manager then left. Another email from Kalabhumi residents was sent to AVFO 'ATDC' on 15th June regarding the legal notice.

The CPWD again returned onsite to dig on 21st June, and the LT electricity cables going towards Existence were destroyed before the residents could halt the work. The CPWD returned on 23rd June, but as a Kalabhumi resident had dug out the earth partially covering the pipeline on the community side to show them the angle and location of the pipe, they left. Since mid June, neither the AWS nor the CPWD has returned.

AV COUNCIL ROOM VIGIL - ONE YEAR OF PRESENCE

Last July 2022, with no prior warning, the AV Council received an email from the AVFO 'ACUR management team' ordering them to vacate their room in Town Hall by 12 noon the following day. Over the past year, a small group of committed residents have maintained a 24/7 presence in the room, thereby ensuring that the RA working groups have a dedicated meeting space in Town Hall. Most recently, when the Residents' Assembly Service discovered that they had been suddenly locked out of their office, they were able to continue to offer their weekly open house in Town Hall because the room was still available. 1st July 2023 marked one year of continuous presence. During that time, there has been an instance of <u>physical violence</u> <u>toward the AVC secretary</u>, as well as inconveniences such as the power being cut and having access to water and the bathroom withheld.

REPORT ON MURTHY'S SITUATION POST LAND EXCHANGE

Murthy, an award-winning stone sculptor, had been working on Auroville land near the tollgate since 2008. In November 2022, he was asked by AVFO 'Landboard' members to vacate the land as they were planning to exchange it with lands inside the Master Plan area. At the time, several promises were made to him, including that he would be given another piece of suitable land and that he would be compensated for the infrastructure costs, which he had invested his personal funds into. On that basis, Murthy shifted to Aurobrindivan in December 2022. However, the Landboard has failed to follow up with Murthy in any way and in March 2023 he was informed that the AVFO will not be providing him with any of the promised compensation. It has also transpired that the 'Landboard' had already exchanged the land in October 2022, prior to any discussion with Murthy about shifting his place of work.

As he has not been able to work since his forced relocation, Murthy has had no income and has been relying on his non-Aurovilian family to survive. Please see <u>here</u> for a full report on Murthy's situation.

RA TDC UPDATE

The RA TDC shared an <u>open letter</u> written to Friend of Auroville <u>Michael Bonke</u>, regarding the clearing work that has recently been taking place on his land which lies within the Auroville Masterplan area. The letter draws his attention to the fact that in accordance with the National Green Tribunal (NGT) verdict, except on limited portions of the Crown Road no work should be carried out until proper township plans have been prepared. The RA TDC <u>massbulletin</u> states that "We feel it is our duty to inform him that we have noted and documented the violations that have been executed in the Auroville project area, aka the Master plan area, on his instructions". On 12th June 2023 a <u>contempt of court</u> notice was filed against the Secretary, members of the AVFO 'ATDC' and 'Landboard', and members of the CPWD in relation to the numerous violations against the NGT verdict.

In recent months the RA TDC has written a number of letters and reports in relation to violations of the NGT judgement by different parties, which can all be found <u>here</u>.

In a <u>letter to the community</u> they shared that "The letters and reports are mostly addressed to the Joint Committee, the CPWD and the Auroville Foundation Office, ... we have also written multiple letters to the various Aurovilians and others (e.g. Michael Bonke) that are going against our agreed-upon community processes and RAD decisions, reminding them about the NGT judgement of April 2022".



The Project Coordination Group (PCG) will be meeting to review grant proposals for possible funding by Stichting De Zaaier. The last date to submit proposals for this call is Monday, 7 August 2023. You are welcome to submit earlier or send us a draft version of your proposal for comment prior to the due date. (If you plan to submit a proposal, please carefully read this full announcement to the end!) All documents related to this purpose are to be submitted in the prescribed forms as attachments, emailed to pcg@auroville.org.in.

Please note that in case your proposal is not ready by this date, there will be another call for proposals for SDZ later this year.

The Project Coordination Group will check whether proposals fall within the SDZ funding criteria and forward those that do to the SDZ Board for final selection and grant allocation.

Stichting de Zaaier welcomes project proposals for:

- research studies in the fields of sociology, economy, psychology and inner development;
- exploratory (research) studies into the relations with the world outside Auroville, in particular with the villages (and villagers) surrounding Auroville, as well as proposals for initiatives that seek to contribute to strengthening these relations;
- initiatives that seek to enhance the efficient co-operation of Aurovilians with the aim of making full use of the existing potential in Auroville;
- studies exploring a sustainable future for Auroville and initiatives contributing to such a future;
- initiatives requiring seed money (micro-projects) for innovative and informal education and training, women's development, outreach as well as proposals prepared by youth.

Please note that funds are generally not available for infrastructure, buildings or transport. Requests for equipment will only be considered if specifically required for the implementation of the project and are not already available in Auroville.

Therefore, it is important that all the relevant bodies (i.e. schools, teachers, school boards, etc.) are aware of your project and support it. In this way, the Project Coordination Group can more easily recommend a project for funding knowing it will have the support of schools and thereby have a greater impact on the beneficiaries of the project.

New: Sanskrit with Kaushal

Beginner

Great news for Sanskrit learners! We are going to start a new Sanskrit Beginners Course with Kaushal this August!

Growing up in a traditional environment with exposure to Sanskrit texts, Kaushal pursued his interest in Sanskrit more actively later in life. KEEP THE RESIDENTS' SERVICE INFORMED

Dear Aurovilians, Newcomers and Auroville Youth,

Our Residents Service tries its best to maintain proper records for everyone. As most of us, both Indians and foreign residents, are in the habit of going in and out of Auroville without informing them it makes their work of maintaining correct records harder.

You are therefore requested to make sure that:

1. As a foreign resident you inform the Residents Service when you are traveling out of Auroville for a period of 2 months (within India) or out of India for even1 day or more.

 All Indian Residents are requested to respect and do the same.

3. This is because the X-Visa requires all foreign residents to live and work in Auroville for 9 months minimum, per year. Indian residents may respect the same requirement in the spirit of the Charter for all and keep the Residents Service informed. The same applies to OCI card holders.

4. Auroville Youth going out for higher studies are requested to keep the Residents Service informed if they need to stay out for longer than 3 years together with their reasons. Staying out beyond 5 years without informing the Residents Service or Housing will mean that they are taken off the Master List.

The person will then have to restart his or her process on return.

5. In the case of Aurovilians having to stay out for longer periods to take care of elderly parents the same process as above (4) will apply.

6. If you decide to leave Auroville, for whatever reason, please inform the Working Committee at <u>workingcom@</u> <u>auroville.org.in</u> so they can update the Residents Service.

Please make a note of these details and don't forget to keep the Residents Service informed.
