Is it possible to find a spot where the embryo or seed of the future supramental world could be created? The plan had come in all its details; but it is a plan which, in its spirit and consciousness, does not conform at all to what is possible on earth at the moment; and yet, in its most material manifestation, it was based on earthly conditions. This is the concept of an ideal town which would be the nucleus of an ideal country, and whose only contacts with the outside world would be purely superficial and extremely limited in their effects. Therefore already—but this, however, is possible—one would have to conceive of a power great enough to be a protection against both aggression or bad will-that would not be the most difficult protection to obtain—and against infiltration, mixture. But if need be, one can conceive of that. From the social point of view, from the point of view of organisation, from the point of view of inner life, these are not problems; the problem is the relation with what is not supramentalised, to prevent infiltration, mixture, that is, to prevent this nucleus from falling back into an inferior creationit is a period of transition.

All those who have thought about this problem have always imagined something unknown to the rest of humanity, like a gorge in the Himalayas, for example, a place unknown to the rest of the world. But that is not a solution; it is not a solution at all.

No, the only solution is an occult power, but this implies that a certain number of individuals must have already achieved a great perfection of realisation before anything at all can be done. But one can conceive that if that can be done, one could have, isolated in the midst of the outside world—without any contacts, you see—an area thing, each person, each movement, is exactly in its place—and in

its place in an ascending, progressive movement, with no relapse — that is, the very opposite of what happens in ordinary life. Of course, this supposes a kind of perfection, a kind of unity, this supposes that the various aspects of the Supreme can be manifested; and necessarily, an exceptional beauty, a total harmony, and a power great enough to command obedience from the forces of Nature; for example, even if this place were surrounded by forces of destruction, they would have no power to act; the protection would be sufficient. All this demands the utmost perfection in the individuals organising such a thing.

NOTE:

- A Newcomer becomes an 'Aurovilian' once his/her name has been confirmed by The Admission Committee (aka the Entry Board) after following due process.
- The date of becoming 'Aurovilian' is the date of confirmation.
 An Aurovilian confirmed by the Entry Board is eligible to participate in all community decision-making processes.
- The formal administrative step of entering new residents into the Register of Residents (RoR), is done by the Secretary of the Auroville Foundation. For this, a B-Form is filled in and signed by the individual and a meeting with the Secretary is arranged by the Entry Secretariat. However, until such time as a new Secretary is appointed, the meetings of Confirmed Aurovilians with the Secretary will be pending.

Dear Friends,

As you may know, the Entry Service has been functioning with reduced capacity since January 2024.

The actions taken to stop the work given to the Entry Service by the Residents' Assembly persist. However, according to the Auroville Foundation Act, the power to admit and terminate names from the register of residents is within the exclusive domain of the Residents' Assembly. The new regulations were challenged before the Madras High Court and have been stayed, but have not been finally heard and disposed.

Be that as it may, the Entry Board team has been reconstituted according to the Residents' Assembly approved process and 3 ongoing members welcomed 5 new members. The team has been meeting regularly since May 2024.

However, we have been advised not to process new applications for the time being.

We intend to use this time to *take up pending work* such as requesting mentor reports, and Newcomer self assessments. We plan to resume completing the Newcomer processes, some of which have been left pending for over 6 months as soon as we are advised to do so.

We apologize for the delays however it has been due to circumstances beyond our control.

We pray for relief by the courts in due time.

FROM THE AUROVILLE COUNCIL

REPORT FOR JULY, AUGUST, AND SEPTEMBER

Dear Community,

Our latest AVC report comes at a time of significant challenges for our community. The Council acknowledges the difficulties we face, but we want to remind all Aurovilians that our primary focus should remain on the **greater purpose** that brought us to Auroville: to create a universal township dedicated to human unity, peace, and sustainable living.

In Auroville, as the cradle of a new consciousness, it's not just about what we achieve, but how we go about achieving it. Our focus must be on the process, not merely the outcome. It's crucial that we work together to maintain the proper functioning of our internal organisation and uphold the principles of fairness and natural justice. The way we make decisions, resolve conflicts, and implement changes is as important as the decisions themselves.

By embodying higher empathy, mutual respect, and adherence to our established methods in our day-to-day interactions and governance, we're not just maintaining order—we're actively cultivating the elevated consciousness that is central to Auroville's mission. This approach of prioritising 'how' over 'what' is essential in our role as pioneers of a new way of living and being.

Let's not lose sight of our shared vision and values as we navigate through these difficulties. Together, we can demonstrate that our community's strength lies not only in our goals but in the compassionate and conscious way we pursue them.

Community Connections

Our local Community meetings have been ongoing, reflecting our commitment to maintaining proper functioning and upholding the principles of fairness in our internal organisation. We are deeply grateful to the residents who have welcomed us and openly shared their views. These gatherings serve as vital platforms not only for discussion but also for disseminating essential information on various topics such as our internal organisational structure, collective decision-making processes, and the importance of adhering to established methods for change.



Many participants have expressed appreciation for the smaller, more intimate format of these meetings, where they feel comfortable expressing their thoughts and raising questions. This setting allows for a

deeper exploration of how we can embody the higher empathy and mutual respect that are crucial to Auroville's mission, even as we navigate challenges.

We plan to continue these efforts, seeing them as opportunities to reinforce our shared vision and values. We hope to see even more new faces at upcoming sessions, as this initiative is only possible with your active participation. Your engagement in these discussions is vital to our collective growth and our ability to demonstrate that Auroville's strength lies not only in our goals but in the conscious and compassionate way we pursue them.

Council Open House

The Council continues to host an open house every **Thursday** from 10:00 to 11:00 a.m., in the Council room, embodying our belief that building Auroville is a collective endeavour that requires open dialogue and active participation. These sessions provide a regular, accessible platform for you to share your thoughts, ideas, and concerns directly with Council members. We warmly invite all Aurovilians to join us during these hours to discuss any topics of interest, from day-to-day community matters to broader visions for our future.

RAS Membership

The Residents' Assembly Service (RAS) is responsible for facilitating communication and decision-making processes within the community. It serves as a bridge between the residents and various working groups, ensuring that the voices of Aurovilians are heard and considered in the organisation of Auroville.

The RAS is tasked with organising and conducting the Residents' Assembly Decision-making (RAD) process, which is a vital mechanism for collective decision-making in Auroville. Through the RAD, residents can propose, discuss, and vote on important community issues, ensuring that decisions reflect the collective will of the community.

With their trial period concluding on October 23rd, Franklin, Pala, and Vignesh are **now official members** of the Residents' Assembly Service. Their journey with us is just beginning, and we're eager to see the positive changes they'll inspire. Let's unite in supporting them to enhance our collective organisation, as we move forward together in Auroville.

New Selection Process Proposal

The Council recently received a proposal from a resident regarding a new selection process. Recognizing the importance of thoughtful consideration and community approval, we advised the individual to submit the proposal through the Residents' Decision-Making (RAD) process. This ensures a fair and transparent review by the wider community.

Residents interested in initiating an RAD proposal are reminded that they need to gather **60 signatures** in support of their proposal. The RAS is responsible for assisting residents in this endeavour, providing guidance and support to ensure the proposal is effectively presented and considered by the community.

We encourage such proactive participation in our collective organisation as it is essential for a healthy community, fostering engagement, inclusivity, and building trust in our decision-making processes

Entry Service

We are pleased to see that the Entry Board has resumed its essential

work in processing current Newcomers. This restart comes as a welcome development for our community, following the <u>recent legal opinion</u> that has provided clarity on the Board's ability to function under the 2020 Regulations. The Council fully supports this move and appreciates the Entry Board's commitment to addressing the backlog of applications and ensuring a smooth continuation of the entry process for those already in the process.

Council Maintenance and Budget

Due to the recent budget cuts imposed by the Governing Board-appointed FAMC (Fund and Asset Management Committee), the Council has been facing significant challenges in securing financial support for its members. In response, a few Council members went to the GB FAMC office in August to discuss the matter. We met with Chandresh, who stated that the decision to cut our budget was not made by the FAMC but came from the Secretary of the Auroville Foundation. We emphasised the importance of the Auroville Council, as it is a Resident Assembly-selected body mandated to serve a vital role in the internal functioning of Auroville.

Auroville.org.in


As you have probably been aware for a while, whoever controls the "auroville.org.in" domain has, as we understand it, censored anyone they do not agree with, such as the RA working groups, including the Council. This limits our official communication capacities with other entities. In order to bypass this limitation we had to resort to using our members' personal emails. We are mentioning this because some recipients of our emails refuse to

acknowledge our communications on this basis.

Dehashakti

In July, the Council received a letter from the former Dehashakti team expressing concerns about the lack of genuine collaboration with the newly established AVPEB. Despite numerous efforts and a willingness to collaborate, they reported that no true partnership was realised. A proposal for meaningful collaboration—developed jointly by the Dehashakti team, SAIIER, and the Teacher's Centre

—was apparently disregarded. While we acknowledge the intent to enhance the teachers' knowledge and skills, we question how this process was managed, particularly concerning those who were dismissed due to failing assessments or being unable to attend the training course.



On August 28th, we met with the executives of Dehashakti, to discuss the events that transpired there involving the Auroville Physical Education Board (AVPEB). During our conversation, it was evident that the teachers have a deep commitment to their work at Dehashakti, with some members having dedicated over 15 years of service. Despite this dedication, some of the teachers faced dismissals following a training course and assessment. There was a palpable sense of hurt from not being recognized for their sincere contributions to the team. There was also doubt expressed about whether the AVPEB board was formed with due process.

In light of the recent issues between the Dehashakti team and AVPEB, it's pivotal to recall Mother's emphasis on goodwill and unity. The initiative by SAIIER and AVPEB to provide fresh training opportunities signifies a step towards reconciliation, inviting all parties to foster an environment of collaboration and understanding, embodying the true spirit of Auroville.

Compliance with community processes

In recent times, we've noticed a concerning trend: an unusually high number of executive replacements across various Auroville units. These changes have been implemented without providing sufficient explanations to the outgoing executives or those directly impacted by the transitions. Moreover, there has been no evident improvement in the performance or operations of these units following these leadership changes. This pattern raises questions about the decision-making process and the overall effectiveness of such abrupt organisational shifts.

As the Auroville Council it is our duty to bring to the attention of those responsible that according to the Code of Conduct 2017 there are certain procedures required for the dismissal of executives, and it would appear that these have not been followed in many cases, including those concerning PTPS and Afsanah Guesthouse. The Auroville Council's mandate encompasses ensuring fair decision-making processes within community groups, overseeing the proper functioning of internal organisation, and upholding principles of natural justice for all Aurovilians.

Afsanah Guest House

The Auroville Council heard with concern that the management of Afsanah Guest House was being changed. It is of concern that despite the team's highly successful management and multiple requests to be appointed/confirmed as executives, no valid reasons were ever given for not doing so.

We were concerned that their success had not been fully appreciated by the trustees, nor by the GB appointed FAMC themselves, and that this decision was made without any due process to replace them. The GB-FAMC also instructed Financial Services to freeze all accounts of Afsanah Guest House, and the Afsanah team was not informed of this action.

Numerous emails were sent by the Council and the existing management team to all parties involved, clearly explaining the current situation. Despite our repeated attempts to emphasise the importance of due process, this unfair treatment towards fellow Aurovilians continues. The Council sent an email to the GB FAMC, expressing their serious concern and seeking a response, but none has been received so far. You can review the contents of the email here

In the meantime, GB-FAMC appointed executives, contacted PTPS and HERS, requesting them to stop providing groceries for the Guesthouse ordered by the guest house team. Additionally, the internet connection, telephone services, and funds were cut off, and maintenance suspended. The Council sent emails to various service providers requesting them to support the ongoing team until the situation is clarified. We would like to extend our gratitude to all the services that have continued to support the Guesthouse and the RA process during this period.

The Council met with the guest house team to hear their views. The Council also invited the GB-FAMC appointees to present their perspective as Aurovilians; however, we have not received any response from them. Similar invitations were extended to GB-FAMC appointed guesthouse trustees who responded without any spirit of cooperation.

The Council wishes to make it clear that we welcome dialogue, and are willing to listen to any perspective on this or any other issue. Our aim is to find a solution which can accommodate the different perspectives, while honouring the values which Auroville stands for.

PTPS (Pour Tous Purchasing Service)

The Auroville Council heard with great concern that an executive from PTPS was dismissed before the completion of his term in

March 2025. We understand that no written reasons were given for his dismissal and that he was asked to leave at very short notice. We also understand that he performed his job as an executive with considerable skill and care and that significant improvements in the service have resulted from his appointment, with considerable praise being received from community members, as well as acknowledgment and support from the PTPS staff. We also noted that his appointment and the conversion of the unit to a service was the result of a participatory community process, which we believe should be respected.

It was apparent that the Code of Conduct 2017, was not followed. Accordingly, the Council wrote to the GB FAMC questioning the dismissal and requesting them to ensure that the correct process is followed. [link to email]

On a purely human level we question the rapid dismissal/replacement of any person from a post in Auroville without a proper process. In this case it appears that the dismissal may be the result of disagreements with a trustee. The Auroville Council is always ready to assist with any such disputes and proper community approved processes exist for the resolution of disputes, which aim to resolve such matters to the satisfaction of all parties, and with the care and compassion we all seek as Aurovilians

Conflict Resolution Council (CRC)

We recognize the urgent need to revive our community's conflict resolution services, which have been inactive since the beginning of this year. We are currently exploring ways to evolve and improve this essential service. As part of this process, we are considering renaming it to "Goodwill Restoration Services" to better reflect its purpose and approach.

To ensure a comprehensive approach, the Council is actively consulting with former CRC members and previous Council members. We've identified the creation of a secretariat as a key

priority and are eager to progress in this direction.

To support this initiative, we recently reached out to the community seeking volunteers for a Secretariat group. We are pleased to report that one member has already stepped forward, and we need more support to make this service truly effective. We warmly encourage Aurovilians with experience in conflict resolution or those passionate about fostering harmony in our community to join us in this important endeavour. We appreciate your understanding that, due to budget constraints imposed by the GB-FAMC, we are still exploring options for providing maintenance for this work.

In preparation for this important work, the Council has recently undergone specialised training sessions with a facilitator. These sessions focused on handling conflict cases with the utmost care and sensitivity, and have greatly enhanced our team's capabilities.

Additionally, with members, who are experienced in our internal organisation, we're working closely to analyse and harmonise the various groups and their mandates. This step is crucial for creating a more cohesive and effective conflict resolution framework.

CRP3

CRP3 (Conflict resolution policy section 3) is a group that includes members of the AV Council, the Working Committee of the RA, and the wider community. This group is dedicated to addressing urgent cases that do not fall under the purview of any Working Groups, such as cases involving domestic violence or other immediate threats.

Security Issues

The Council is looking into the issue of Auroville Security to ensure that an active security response is available to all residents at all times, from a dedicated Aurovillan team. The present GB security team, established after the Auroville team was dissolved by order of the Foundation Office, do not appear to be actively pursuing internal issues. Instead please contact the RA-Working Committee directly.

If anyone is interested in being part of re-establishing an Auroville security team, please contact the Council.

Conclusion

As we close this report, we want to express our deep appreciation for the dedication and resilience of our community during these challenging times. The issues we've addressed - from governance and decision-making processes to specific concerns about Auroville units - reflect the complex nature of our collective journey.

We remain committed to fostering open dialogue, transparent processes, and fair resolutions to the challenges we face. Our strength lies in our unity and our shared vision for Auroville. We encourage all residents to stay engaged, participate in community processes, and continue to embody the values that make Auroville unique.

Looking ahead, we will continue to work diligently on improving our conflict resolution mechanisms, enhancing community connections, and ensuring that our internal organisation functions in alignment with Auroville's ideals. We invite your ongoing feedback and participation in these efforts.

Together, we can navigate these challenges and emerge stronger, always keeping in mind the higher purpose that brings us together in Auroville. Let us move forward with renewed commitment to our shared goals, mutual respect, and the spirit of human unity that is at the core of our community.

Thank you for your continued support and involvement in building the Auroville of our dreams.

MEETING NOTES WITH MATRIMANDIR TEAM

WEDNESDAY 14TH AUGUST 2024

Present:

Intention of this meeting was to see where we are since the last meeting we had in April. There was an agreement from the MM team to improve the communications with the community.

1. Follow-Up on Communication:

- Since our last meeting, there has been increased communication with the community. Recently reels are being made regularly by the AV media interface. Jaya is following it up and so far it is not clear where these reels are being shared. It's uncertain if they are being published. This task adds to MM's workload.
- They continue to publish quarterly newsletter and get it published on both the News & Notes editions.
- These quarterly newsletters are published online as Matrimandir bulletins also.

2. Excavation Progress:

start after January.

- Development is stalled due to weather conditions.
 - Work will resume quickly once the rain stops. Currently focusing on lining the two walls for the test pond. A team from Germany is expected to assist. The second part of the work will
- Water levels were suitable before the rain, but now the lake is too full for welding work and it needs to be pumped out.
- Water is currently healthy with no algae.
- Plans are underway to beautify the edges of the lake walls and explore floating islands.

3. Design Evaluation Panel

- The panel is still active and involved in the evaluation process of the Gardens.
- The Garden of Light is inaugurated tomorrow.
- Reviews are also ongoing for the Garden of Wealth and Garden of Utility.
- Blue Palm removal is planned to improve views as per Roger's vision.
- Would it be possible for the MM team to get the feedback from the Community on the Garden Every two years, gardens will be reviewed based on community feedback.
- Ongoing work on beautification of the shoreline and moving the MM workshop. Ganesh and Sonali are working on site permissions from ATDC and will present the building design next week.

4. Road and Hill Access

- CPWD is responsible for MM soil for road construction.
- Access to the hill area is being sought. Passage across village land is complete; access through AV requires coordination with ATDC.
- Planning for Western Bridge access.

5. MM Website:

The website is being developed as a communication platform.
 It will help with donations and showcase text and pictures.

BRIEF NOTE ON RECENT WRITTEN ORDER FROM THE MADRAS HIGH COURT

Dear Community,

On Friday, 18th October, the Madras High Court issued the full written judgment on the Quo Warranto case (the judgement had been pronounced on 1st August, 2024 but the full judgement had not been uploaded) filed by us against the seven residents calling themselves the Working Committee and recognized by the Governing Board. This written judgement also addresses the perjury case against Hemant Lamba. Both of these cases were dismissed on 1st August 2024. The full text of the order is available at this link.

Although we are very satisfied that the wrongful case of perjury against Hemant was dismissed, we are, of course, not satisfied with the outcome of the Quo Warranto case because it was dismissed on technical arguments and had some factual errors. Still, the final order recognizes that "till such time the Regulations are finalized, the directions issued by the First Bench on 04.09.2023 would govern the field qua the management and functioning of Auroville", as has been highlighted in a recent legal opinion by our lawyer. This order does not legitimize the group recognized by the GB as they have not been selected by the RA as per Section 20 of the AVF Act.

We are in consultation with our lawyers about possible next steps to be undertaken to once again have full recognition of the legitimate groups selected by the Residents' Assembly.

FROM L'AVENIR D'AUROVILLE

CONCERNS REGARDING CURRENT ROAD AND MOBILITY PLANNING PRACTICES

As we all know, there are pressing concerns regarding the current practices in road and mobility planning in Auroville. Indeed, the approach undertaken has repeatedly lacked the necessary rigour and foresight essential for sustainable urban development.

Firstly, it is imperative that road and mobility planning be based on thorough traffic modelling to accurately assess movement needs. These needs are dynamic and evolve over time, necessitating prioritisation that reflects current realities. Presently, there is insufficient justification for a high need for vehicle movement that would warrant extensive planning interventions. Specifically, there is no indication of unacceptable severity or regularity of traffic congestion, nor is there a pressing need to facilitate access for sequential urban development. Sustainable planning principles dictate that priority should be given to sites that are already developed or co-located with existing infrastructure, thereby minimising reliance on private vehicular movements. The absence of supporting evidence in this regard is deeply concerning.



Furthermore, any land clearing activities must only occur following a comprehensive and participative planning process, which results in statutory recognised plans and subsequently obtains appropriate site approvals from the planning authority, namely Tamil Nadu.

This process must include thorough assessments of alternative routes and options, taking into account environmental constraints and projections of future mobility needs. Additionally, once routes have been established, it is crucial that planning restrictions are implemented on proposed movement corridors to prevent certain types of development. This strategy is vital to ensure that both strategic and long-term mobility needs are met without premature land clearing. Regrettably, there is a lack of evidence supporting adherence to these critical planning protocols.

It is also essential to acknowledge the repeated statements from the Residents' Assembly, which has unequivocally expressed its disagreement with the manner in which implementation of so-called "plans" is being carried out. (See more about the Master Plan Perspective 2025 here.) The concerns raised by the community highlight a significant disconnect between the developments being undertaken and the needs of the residents.

In conclusion, we strongly urge all stakeholders to reconsider current strategies in road and mobility planning. We must prioritise sustainable practices that reflect community needs, environmental considerations, and long-term urban growth.

RESTRUCTURING AND NEW PUBLISHING **GUIDELINES**

Dear Community,



As announced on 11th September 2024, the RA News & Notes has been going through a restructuring over the last weeks. After one year and a half of publishing, we are now feeling a need to focus on truly becoming a community edition of the News and Notes.

In a nutshell, the RA News & Notes will no longer publish contents that were previously included under the sections "Activities & Events"; "Food, Goods & Services"; and "Classes, Workshops and Healing Arts". We are now limiting ourselves to contents that strengthen community-building in Auroville. More specifically, we will continue to include working group announcements and reports, residents' voices and personal sharings, some cultural events, and information from essential services.

There are three main reasons for this decision:

- 1. Many residents have continued publishing their events in both News and Notes despite being told by the Auroville Council that this legitimizes the censorship applied by the Foundation Office's News and Notes.
- 2. This not only discourages us but also creates a situation where there is a lot of duplication of work. This duplication of work is not something we can sustain on a long-term basis.
- 3. Entering contents under the specific categories we are now discontinuing was taking a good part of our time while our team has very limited resources, both human and financial.

In general, we wish to focus on content that strengthens community-building in Auroville, showcases service-oriented (and non-profit) initiatives, and enables a diversity of perspectives to be shared safely.

Asked Questions document.

We are aware that this new editorial policy may impact some of you and we are sorry for any inconvenience caused. This duplication of work made no more sense for us, and taking this

decision was our only way to continue editing this publication, at the service of the community.

AUROVILLE DOG SHELTER

A TIME FOR COMPASSION: AUROVILLE'S CALL FOR TAKING RESPONSIBILITY



Once again, it is that time of year when countless puppies are born and abandoned like trash in Auroville or thrown at night over our fence. "Out of sight, out of mind. Let it be the shelter's problem!" This happens at least twice a year when dogs reproduce, and our shelter becomes overwhelmed with too many rescues. Daily we are receiving more and more calls, some friendly, some even threatening to take in these helpless animals, but our shelter is operating beyond full capacity with barely any funds, not enough staff, almost out of food and medicines, and no volunteers to help as its rainy season. Despite all our efforts to expand the back area of the shelter to free up space for rescues and sterilizations, we are unable to do more without receiving support.

And then there are always the voices of those who assert that Mother declared: "No dogs in Auroville!" It's simply not true. Maybe contemplate on what Mother said whenever you see a puppy dumped in the streets: "...Personally, I could do praam before a puppy dog, mon petit, in all sincerity—seeing the Lord in it. You only have to think of the Lord, no?" (Agenda 3:343)



It is time for us, as a spiritual community, especially those in Auroville's administration, to realize that raising funds for the municipal dog shelter is a collective responsibility and not solely the shelter's burden. This is not just about money and budgets; it is about compassion, responsibility, and reducing the suffering of living beings.

We urgently need Auroville's backing to ensure that the shelter can continue its mission to keep the Community safe from dangerous diseases like rabies and be finally able to solve the puppy problem for good by systematically sterilizing all dogs to end the suffering and limit the overall dog population. Auroville must stand up to its responsibility and provide at least the basic monthly running costs of Rs. 3 lakhs until the new Auroville Dog Shelter becomes self-sufficient by earning its own income. Let the ideals on which Auroville is based, the words of The Mother, not just be empty words but a daily reminder to extend our love and care to all living beings.

"One can have the true attitude only when one has attained the consciousness of the divine Oneness; meanwhile it is good always to treat animals with respect, love, and compassion."





RESIDENTS SPEAK

THE ISSUE OF TODAY IS FASCISM

ADAPTED FROM A TIMOTHY SNYDER TALK

So let me start with the word.

The word was made up by the fascists themselves. The word was made up by Mussolini. It was meant positively. It became negative after the fascists lost the Second World War. The far left, the communists, the Soviets used the word fascist as a general criticism. And now we're at this curious new place in the 21st century where fascists call other people fascists.

There's the word and there's the thing. So what is the thing? The thing is hard to define because the thing has always been about resisting reason, resisting logic, so resisting definitions, resisting clear concepts.

Fascism is about precisely unreason. It's about emotion. It's about will. It's about will over everything else. And will of everything else means that institutions don't mean anything, constitutions don't mean anything, laws don't mean anything. The only thing that matters is the person who has the strongest will, who of course is the leader.

And so, fascism is characterized by a cult of the will and then also a cult of a particular leader. And the leader is usually at the head of a single party. Because it's a cult of will and because it's about a leader, power ultimately then is going to reside in some kind of big lie, some kind of huge alternative reality in which everyone can reside.

That can very often be a conspiracy theory, (for example, the idea that the Crown Road is a Yantra or that we need 50,000 people to bring about the Supramental change). but it's going to be some

kind of big falsehood, like, you know, I represent the RA or FAMC in an election that I lost or was nominated by the Secretary, that sort of thing. And fascism is going to depend ultimately on violence, and it's not going to have a problem with violence, because after all, if politics is about will, politics is about the leader, politics is about lies, then making the world match the lies to conform to the will of the leader is what followers are going to have to do. And that always means violence.

Fascism is going to end up betraying you. So, I mean, that fascism already exists is a betrayal of me and a betrayal of people like me who think that Auroville should be for individual freedom, and that people should have the right to choose their representatives and participate in its development.

Fascism will end up betraying you. You might think that your leader is going to be around forever, but they won't. They never are. And when you create a fascist state in you community, what you're doing is you're putting your whole community in the hands of a leader who will eventually fail and fall, which means that you're making your own community very vulnerable.

When you choose fascism, you're choosing against all the institutions and all the rules, and that can seem really attractive because you could think, yes, the system was terrible, and now we can finally do what we want. But when everyone can do what they want, and when it's just a matter of spectacle and will and violence and all these things, most people are going to end up being worse off than they were before, and you're going to be one of those people. You're going to be worse off than you were before in pretty much every single way.

And then another thing which is bad about fascism is what it ends up doing to the people. Because of course, right now, you can just say to yourself, well, I'm voting for somebody or fascism, why is that bad? (or not voting in our case- which is then used by AVFO and supporters to call into question the communities voice and will).

Well as the evil continues, you will be drawn into it and you will do things which you will then maybe not be able to explain, not one will explain, rationalize till the day you die and your children and your grandchildren are going to have to be the one's who try to figure it out and pick up the pieces after you in the remnants of this community if there still is a community. And finally, last but not least, fascism is always going to mean, in the end, that you're living a lie, that you're living in somebody elses story.

You might feel what fascism does is it gives you this feeling that, hey, I'm on the right side. I'm with the tough people. It gives you this feeling that you're somebody because you're against something else. But ultimately, that's an empty story.

Ultimately, in that politics of us and them, the them suffer, but the us suffer in a different way. Because in fascism, you turn out not to be anybody at all. In fascism, you turn out just to be a tool, just to be someone who's turned against other people. You turn out not to have any definition at all, and you turn out to be a person without any qualities. You turn out to be just a character in somebody else's story.

So these are the personal things. Leaving aside the fact that fascism was why we fought the Second World War.



AN AUTHORITARIAN GUIDE TO UTOPIA: AVFO EDITION

Ever wondered how to turn a peaceful spiritual community into a bureaucratic nightmare? Look no further than the Auroville Foundation Office's handy guide:

AUROSHASTRI: 04.07.1975 - 11.10.2024



Born in Pondicherry at Cluny Hospital on July 4, 1975, his father Gerhard asked Nolini for his name and received Auroshastri, meaning "he who has knowledge of the divine law." He spent his early years happily alongside many friends — Aurosylle, Sukrit, Ritam, John Bosco, Mukta, Auralice, Angiras and others while living at Isai Ambalam in Auroville.

When he was six, the family moved to Germany for a few years before returning to Auroville in 1989. He attended Kodaikanal International School and at the age of 17 he went back to Germany, where for some years he lived and worked with his father in the clothing industry, travelling a lot. Then their work took them to England for several years before he came back to live in Auroville in 2000 at the age of 25. Among many other things his father taught him to play GO which he continued to enjoy throughout his life.

In later years, he was deeply fascinated by water and dedicated much of his time to researching it. Living waters and natural energies were passions that consumed Shastri, driving his curiosity and commitment to understanding the world around him. He wasn't content with simply reading about concepts—he had to test them, experience them firsthand, and make them his own. Whether it was an experiment he devised or a theory he tested on himself, he held fast to his convictions, even when others didn't understand his thinking.

Walking barefoot on the earth and swimming in the sea were his natural ways of reconnecting, balancing his body in harmony with nature. He explored every new healing technique with deep dedication, diving into its depths until he fully grasped it before moving onto the next discovery. He understood the importance of water for health and the vitality of life itself, recognizing the negative impacts of unnatural, tainted waters long before many others.

Auroshastri had strong convictions and was full of bold, unconventional ideas. He embraced his eccentricity, often enjoying life on the fringe of society. He thought in ways that transcended his time, envisioning a world that others could not always see. He followed his own path and wrote his own life. Throughout his successes and failures he touched many hearts and minds. He is dearly loved and will always be missed. Love never dies.

REMEMBERING JAIRAM

J. Jayaraman, Jairam for those who knew him, joined Auroville at a very young age in 1970. He was born in Alankuppam (1959) and his childhood in the village had been a difficult one. He had ended up staying with his grandmother in Kottakarai, who was



also hardly able to look after him. As soon as he heard that Auroville was coming, he applied to join. With Varadharajan as an intermediary, he was accepted by The Mother and began living with Daniel (an American pioneer Aurovilian) on his farm in Kottakarai.

All he aspired to do in Auroville was being of service. Very early on he worked with Paul Vincent as a tractor driver, ploughing some newly acquired fields which later became Djaima, and started Volunteering at Matrimandir with Ruud (another pioneer Aurovilian), and also as a tractor driver, and in MM construction work. Later one could find him at the entrance to the Chamber and served under the guidance of Arjun Puri and John H.

While he worked at Matrimandir he stayed at the Matrimandir Camp for many years, then later moved to Shanthi Community.

He got married to Boomadevi and had a daughter, Vijaya and a son, Viji (Vijaykumar).

Unfortunately, he lost both his legs due to gangrene, and his only sadness was that his body would not allow him any longer to be of full service to Auroville. But he did not give up, even though he had to go through multiple operations due to health issues.

Many people driving or cycling past the Matrimandir during the past few years would have seen Jayaraman sitting on his wheelchair on the side of the road close to the Matrimandir gate near the big Peepul tree. He would lovingly greet passers-by and chat with them, and also guide guests who wanted to go to the Matrimandir or were looking for other locations in Auroville. He did this service for a long time, till very recently when, due to a head injury caused by a fall, he passed away on Friday 11th October

2024, aged 65, at his residence. The funeral took place at the Auroville Cremation Ground the next day, Saturday 12th October.







And recognized this strange familiar site


As one who passes through a childhood town Remembers lanes forgotten by the rest, Knows secrets no adult has ever guessed And every path his feet have travelled down.

The film won Special Prize "Un Certain Regard" 2014 Cannes Film Festival.

Synopsis: After leaving Brazil for political reasons in the late 1960s, Sebastião Salgado began a career in France as an economist. When his wife, Lélia, bought a camera, however, he discovered a love of photography, and changed professions. With Lelia's support, he began working full-time as a photographer in 1973, initially doing photojournalism before transitioning to a more documentary style. Salgado's own photos and videos are used to illustrate his life and work, beginning with his exile from Brazil and subsequent transition from economist to artist and explorer...


