

NOTE:

- A Newcomer becomes an 'Aurovilian' once his/her name has been confirmed by The Admission Committee (aka the Entry Board) after following due process.
- The date of becoming 'Aurovilian' is the date of confirmation. An Aurovilian confirmed by the Entry Board is eligible to participate in all community decision-making processes.
- The formal administrative step of entering new residents into the Register of Residents (RoR), is done by the Secretary of the Auroville Foundation. For this, a B-Form is filled in and signed by the individual and a meeting with the Secretary is arranged by the Entry Secretariat. However, until such time as a new Secretary is appointed, the meetings of Confirmed Aurovilians with the Secretary will be pending.

Dear Friends,

As you may know, the Entry Service has been functioning with reduced capacity since January 2024.

The actions taken to stop the work given to the Entry Service by the Residents' Assembly persist. However, according to the Auroville Foundation Act, the power to admit and terminate names from the register of residents is within the exclusive domain of the Residents' Assembly. The new regulations were challenged before the Madras High Court and have been stayed, but have not been finally heard and disposed.

Be that as it may, the Entry Board team has been reconstituted according to the Residents' Assembly approved process and 3 ongoing members welcomed 5 new members. The team has been meeting regularly since May 2024.

However, we have been advised not to process new applications for the time being.

We intend to use this time to take up pending work such as requesting mentor reports, and Newcomer self assessments. We plan to resume completing the Newcomer processes, some of which have been left pending for over 6 months as soon as we are advised to do so.

We apologize for the delays however it has been due to circumstances beyond our control.

We pray for relief by the courts in due time.

CLARIFICATION ON RECENT ARTICLE ABOUT MHC JUDGEMENT ON AUROVILLE WORKING COMMITTEE

Dear Respected Sir, In response to the article in your publication titled, 'Attempts to regulate Auroville's functioning are met with resistance and litigation says Madras HC', we request you to please take note of the following clarification and publish this as a letter to the editor or, ideally, as a new article, in order to provide a balanced perspective on this matter.

Recent press releases and various communications across media platforms, including in your publication, have suggested that the Madras High Court order issued on 01.08.2024 and uploaded only last week by a single bench, has given legal sanctity to the 7 members of the Working Committee of the Residents' Assembly of the Auroville Foundation recognized by the office of the Secretary to the Governing Board. In consultation with our lawyers, we would like to clarify the following:

• The order issued by the single bench does not provide a final or conclusive validation of the composition of the Working Committee. It merely states that the members cannot be disqualified through a Quo Warranto petition, indicating that the legal tool used in this case was procedurally unsuitable. Importantly, the order explicitly states:

"This Court cannot, and it is not inclined to go into the aspect of whether the respondents or, for that matter, the members of the petitioner Committee have earned any disqualification on this score."

- The petitioner in this case is the Working Committee of the Residents' Assembly, and the court seems to have expressed inability to decide that issue in light of the facts and circumstances recorded in the judgement.
- Moreover, we are advised to state that the single bench order does not, and cannot, override the previous orders of the division bench led by the Chief Justice of the Madras High Court. Notably, the division bench order dated 23.02.2024 states:

"Until further orders, the functioning of the Working Committee under Section 20 of the AVF Act shall not be interfered with by the Committee constituted under the impugned regulations and the Working Committee shall be one as constituted under Section 20(3) of the Act."

• It remains our stand that since the 7 respondents in the writ petition filed do not enjoy the confidence of the Residents Assembly, they cannot represent the Residents Assembly of Auroville.

 Additionally, the single bench order of 1.8.2024 reiterates that the directions issued by the division bench on 4th September 2023 will govern the management and functioning of Auroville. The court recognizes that:

"The Residents' Assembly may carry out its functions as provided in Sections 18, 19, and 20 of the Auroville Foundation Act without any interference."

 To reiterate, Section 20 of the AVF Act, 1988, provides for the Working Committee of the Residents' Assembly of Auroville to be elected by the Residents' Assembly alone. This order mandates no interference with the Residents' Assembly and their Working Committee. Therefore, we are advised to state that the single judges order would be in conflict with the judgement of the division bench.

In light of these points, we are taking steps and measures to ensure that clarity is restored on this matter.

AUROVILLE DOG SHELTER

MONTHLY TRANSPARENCY REPORT OCTOBER 2024

Overview

- New admissions: 29 (322 since April 2023 18 tiny puppies dumped over the gate!)
- Rabies suspect cases: 1
- · Adoptions and Releases: 7

- Vaccinations administered: approx. 100 (900 since start of the vaccination drive)
- ABC shelter dog sterilizations: 19 (129 since February)
- Deworming: approx. 100

Donations

This month was a huge challenge as we had started with Rs. 1.3 lakh in the minus from the expenses of last month. We also had to pay Diwali bonus to our workers. Our medicine stock is still depleted, so we cannot treat certain diseases as we need more money to order new stock at the moment. We cut all unnecessary expenses and even had to ration food for our dogs. We did whatever we could to fundraise, but not enough donations came in. Despite the severe budget situation, we continue our expansion project in a fight against the monsoon, working hard to finish the construction of the backside area to finally move some dogs and free up some urgently needed space. This October, Rs. 224.904 arrived in our FS account and Rs. 239.500 in our bank account, which includes Rs. 50.000 from BCC and also donations sent by AVI USA (USD 512) and AVI Germany (EUR 130). The donation amount also includes Rs. 47.500, which we have received for the paid sterilizations we conducted at cost price.

Expenditures

Animal Food: This month we had to reduce the food amount we give to our dogs as we didn't have enough funds. We fed our dogs 1.6 tons of rice, 1.5 tons of chicken, and



700 eggs, supplemented with donated food items like vegetables and daal which cost us approx. 0.8 lakh.

Staff Costs: Despite the serious funding situation, we decided to show appreciation to our hard-working staff and paid a Diwali bonus to every member who was entitled to it. Total staff costs for this month for our workers paid animal care staff, 2 veterinarians, and volunteers were approx. Rs. 1.98 lakh this month.

Medical Costs: This month, we could only buy urgent medicines and spent Rs 4.000. Our stock of medicines is exhausted after the last two months' free treatment program of 900 dogs and cats during our vaccination drive, and we require immediate funds to procure more. We have another Parvo outbreak among rescued puppies and don't even have the medicine to treat them.

Infrastructure Improvements: Expanding the shelter to gain space for rescues and sterilization by building the HOPE area has stretched our finances to the maximum. After having utilized the TNAWBI infrastructure grant for phase one of the project, which has been completed (dog secure fencing, channel system, drainage pond, water supply, electricity) we had to use Rs. 554.492 this month for fences, cement, gravel, water pipes, bricks, granite pillars, sand etc and other building materials. We are still lacking funds for 200 meters of fence (Rs. 28000) so that we can open our new enclosures for our beloved residents.



Expansion of HOPE: Serenity Building Improvements and Sterilizations


As part of our shelter temporary expansion, as we have to spend another monsoon season in the old crumbling shelter, we're happy to report on the recent improvements and plans underway to increase our sterilization efforts. Thanks to Youth Center and Youth Link, we received 20 dog houses, which our dogs love! To enhance these houses further, we reached out to Matrimandir for additional plastic cutoffs from the lake project to create more durable flooring for the dog houses.

In addition, our Serenity Building is undergoing a significant transformation. Previously, it housed six cells that, because of poor ventilation and a hot metal roof, were a horrible place for dogs to live. With the HOPE area nearing completion, we are able to make each of the six rooms in the Serenity Building into individual dormitories, each with a private garden and a dog house. These enhancements will allow the dogs to enjoy outdoor space and have a cozy and dry place to sleep at night while freeing up our smaller front enclosures for space to be used for post-sterilization recovery.

This shift opens the capacity to increase sterilizations from 4 to 20 per week, enabling us to reach 1,000 surgeries annually, a level that would finally solve the overpopulation issue for good. However, this increase requires an estimated Rs. 15 lakh in funding to cover the projected free-of-charge 1,000 sterilizations. We are doing all we can to fundraise to reach this goal, which will improve the animal situation dramatically in Auroville and the entire area.

We are using every free minute trying to raise essential funds for our shelter and dogs, yet the support we urgently need hasn't fully arrived. To expand our reach and impact,



come together, guided by the spirit of service and integral yoga, to make a difference! Be part of this change!

Support the Auroville Dog Shelter Petition

In recent months, we've been reaching out to members of the Auroville administration to emphasize the urgent need for increased funding for the Auroville Dog Shelter. Currently, our monthly support stands at Rs. 50,000, which is insufficient to cover the Rs. 3 lakh necessary for basic survival. Despite our efforts, our appeals have so far fallen on deaf ears with the outgoing administration.

To amplify our message, we've started a petition, which has already gathered over 800 signatures in a short time. We hope this initiative will encourage the incoming Auroville administration and new members of working groups to reconsider their short-sighted stance and support the monthly funding needed for the municipal shelter so that we can continue to serve the AV Community. Once the new Auroville Dog Shelter is built we strive to become 100% self-sufficient by earning our own income to keep the shelter running and constantly evolving.

New Auroville Dog Shelter - update/no update

The recent changes in Auroville's administration, with no new Auroville Secretary appointed as of yet together with the sabotage of the project by certain individuals have caused delays in releasing our already allocated Rs. 2 crore of government funds and issuing the building permission NOC for the RERS site. These approvals are crucial to moving forward with our long-delayed new Auroville Dog Shelter construction. We understand that significant changes within the Foundation's personnel are anticipated soon, and we remain hopeful that the upcoming administration will help us advance our plans for the new shelter swiftly.



RESIDENTS SPEAK

PART 1 - VIKAS RADIAL WORK QUESTIONED



AUROCITY NEWS DESK

Sunday 27/10/2024

Communities along Vikas radial had many questions about the work that started on Wednesday. They sent emails with questions about the work, timeline, plan, and even how it was going to affect the trees.

Below is one letter that was sent after watching the maddening disruption for three days by one community. As of Tuesday, it was not answered.

Auroville Foundation TDC Townhall Auroville

Dear Sindhuja/ Govind/ all,

We are disappointed that the work on the radial is happening without any prior communication to the communities impacted. And that our needs during this considerable work at the only road accessing our communities are being ignored.

We have learned that this work is estimated to last 3 months and we are concerned that this work is starting at the very beginning of the monsoon period. At the moment, there is no stable surface creating a precarious situation for our vehicles and emergency services to pass through or even access. The coming rains will

only make this worse.

Recognizing that we have many elders for whom navigation on rough, unstable, or slippery surfaces is a challenge, we request that safe access be given to all communities during the interim and that the



removal of the older surface and application of the new or temporary surface be done in phases so as to minimise disruption.

The Vikas Radial serves its residents well. If one of the main reasons is to create infrastructure connectivity between the 2 sides of the road every 25m, we request you to reconsider the need for the huge scale of this current workplan. The spacing between buildings is far more than 25m. We have seen how the Road

Service created the sewer line from Vibrance to the opposite side of the road with minimal disruption and cost. This model could work very well for the existing radial, while any new parts can use the new design.

We request someone from your team to meet with the impacted communities and provide an actual update on the plan, timeframe etc. and get input before any more work is done. It can happen Monday or Tuesday before Diwali, avoiding further disruption while minimising delay.

PART 2 - VIKAS RADIAL WORK STOPPED

AUROCITY NEWS DESK

Monday 28/10/2024

Tired of being ignored, actually more like purposely stomped on, Auroville residents affected by the sudden onset of the digging up of the most used road gathered at the site of work on the Vikas radial.

They prepared a list of questions to be relayed to Town Hall by the supervising engineer at the site. The young man was most courteous but unable to answer questions or get any of the people in charge of the project to come and answer.

The people had a long list of questions that needed to be answered:

- 1. Why were not there any announcements about the activity informing the affected population and allowing users to prepare alternatives?
- Considering the large number of people who are uncomfortable driving two-wheelers on bumpy, muddy, unstable, or slippery surfaces, access and alternatives (including diverting heavier traffic) need to be provided.
- 3. Vikas Radial was the best road in Auroville, what was the need to redo it? Trenches can be dug as needed for existing communities along road at much less cost and disruption.
- 4. Aurovilians wanted to know the basics of the planned road: how much wider? higher?
- 5.A major issue was about timing during the monsoon. The monsoon would cause havoc with the alternative paths and also delay the project. Why work on the busiest radial during the worst period of the year?
- 6. Some wanted full details of the project:
- i. Detailed Estimates
- ii. Cross-section of the road and the trenches
- iii. Good For Construction Drawings
- iv. Detailed Project Report

The CPWD website only has the following:

- i. Notice Inviting Tender
- ii. Letter of Authorisation
- iii. Letter of Commencement.

After watching a couple of truckloads of road being removed, the people asked for a pause until an answer via email or inperson was received.



Work was stopped and the supervisor got a roller to go over the exposed blue-metal layer and removed obstructions to the entry/exit paths of communities. The workers with their vehicles were sent to work on other radials.

PART 3 - PETITION TO STOP LAND EXCHANGES SUBMITTED

AUROCITY NEWS DESK

Wednesday 30/10/2024

A group of concerned residents made a petition to the Sub-Registrar Vanur.

The Sub-Registrar politely received the petition and acknowledged that there is probably wrongdoings and he is aware that this matter is under investigation.

He assured the group that ever since complaints have been received, he has not carried out any further exchanges. He plans to continue to stick to the stance till the time clarity is received from his superiors that he can go ahead with registrations.

He also pointed out that recently one request for one exchange registration had come and he has already put that on hold and hold pending inquiry. An educated guess is that this is the reason for ex-Secretary Jayanti Ravi's visit. The residents are awaiting to see what pressure will be applied and what will be the result.



The Sub-Registrar also appreciated the representatives from the Residents Assembly preparing the petition, listing the facts and identifying the wrongs and who all are investigating it.

He had an idea to share the petition with whosoever comes for a land exchange registration.

As a follow-up action, the Resident Assembly gropu plans to send the petition to the other officials in the Land Administration of Tamil Nadu by our registered post. This includes the

Inspector General of Registrations in Chennai, the District Registrar in Tindivanam, and the District Collector.

The petition included attachments like the newspaper announcement that Resident Assembly does not agree with the registration and letters by the local representatives, MLA, MP, asking them not to do this.

The news service will share all the files with all the residents in the next edition.

PART 4 - FOUNDATION INSIDERS PROTEST LAND ACTIONS

AUROCITY NEWS DESK

Tuesday 29/10/2024

The Diwali season is clearly explosive in Auroville. In what has been an action-filled week, the latest outburst came from inside Town Hall itself.

A strongly worded letter signed by Selvaraj and Tine (members of the Not-the-Residents Working Committee), Rajavelu and Venkat (Not-for-Residents Land Service), Jacques, Jayendra (new members of the Not-for-Residents Land Service), and Satyakam (Consultant) protested against the extremely Auroville-draining land exchanges that have occurred.

The 4-page missive was uploaded to Auronet and pulled down quickly by another of their colleagues. But the damage was done as a few residents downloaded the document and shared it over social media.

Excerpts from the document show the level of depravity emanating from Town Hall that even their own team is getting disgusted:

... the Working Committee received one land exchange proposal which is <u>ready to be registered</u>, but not from the official AV Foundation side but from another source. <u>The Working Committee has not been asked to give its recommendation.</u>

Mr. Kabbali is supposed to receive very valuable Auroville land on the Tindivanam highway where 1 acre is worth 10 crores of rupees. The land *Mr.* Kabbali would offer to Auroville in exchange is not in the city as stated but in the greenbelt. Also, the 3 small pieces of greenbelt land are totally not important for Auroville's development.

Other examples of the exchanges done were shared, addressed to: Honorable Chairman, dear Governing Board members.

The timing of the letter along with ex-Secretary Jayanti Ravi's visit does provide some fireworks during Diwali. And an unsigned request for a large amount of funds sent from the Not-for-Auroville FAMC email to the Financial Service hopefully also caused a large explosion there.

And the news that more and more dissatisfaction in the unauthorised committees with where the GB is taking Auroville and destroying the work and the dream is a candle of light for the Residents during the darkest night of the year.

REMINDER - RESTRUCTURING AND NEW PUBLISHING GUIDELINES

Dear Community,

As <u>announced on 11th September 2024</u>, the RA News & Notes has been going through a restructuring over the last weeks. After one year and a half of publishing, we are now feeling a need to **focus on truly becoming a community edition of the News and Notes.**

& NOTES

In a nutshell, the RA News team has decided to <u>discontinue</u> <u>publishing the sections</u>:

- Activities & Events;
- Food, Goods & Services; and
- · Classes, Workshops and Healing Arts. (See attachment)

We are now limiting ourselves to content that **strengthens community-building** in Auroville, showcases service-oriented (and non-profit) initiatives, and enables a diversity of perspectives to be shared safely. More specifically, we will continue to include RA Working Groups' announcements and reports, as well as a link to contents from the Foundation Office groups (in a spirit of inclusivity and giving space to all perspectives), and also residents' voices and personal sharings, some cultural events, and information from essential Services.

There are three main reasons for this decision:

- 1. Many residents have continued publishing their events in both News & Notes despite being told by the Auroville Council that this legitimizes the censorship applied by the Foundation Office's News & Notes.
- This not only discourages us but also creates a situation where there is a lot of duplication of work. This duplication of work is not something we can sustain on a long-term basis.
- 3. Entering contents under the specific categories we are now discontinuing was taking a good part of our time while our team has very limited resources, both human and financial.

If you have questions about our new publication guidelines, and what can or cannot be included, you can read this Frequently Asked Questions document.

We are aware that this new editorial policy may impact some of you and we are sorry for any inconvenience caused. This duplication of work made no more sense for us, and taking this decision was our only way to continue editing this publication, at the service of the community.

(Note: We can make exceptions to our new publication rules for contents that are submitted only to the RA News and Notes (and not to the other one), as this would not be a case of duplication of work. If this could interest you, please clearly indicate in your submission to us that you are only publishing your content in the RA News and Notes. We will treat these requests on a case-bycase basis.)

Thank you for your understanding and support. It means a lot to us.
