

FROM L'AVENIR D'AUROVILLE

RA-TDC: LETTER REGARDING EXTENSIVE ABUSE OF TREES

Dear Residents,

On February 28th, a <u>letter</u> was sent to high government officials, the Joint Committee, the GB and the IAC. It addresses concerns about the constant and consistent abuse of trees by the GB-appointed ATDC and the CPWD, both overseen by the AVFO.

Despite the pending Supreme Court judgment on the NGT case, reports highlight unauthorised tree felling, financial opacity in timber sales, and ecological harm such as failed "transplantation" and bark stripping. The GB-ATDC, CPWD, and AVFO have yet to address these concerns. Sustainable development, environmental accountability, and responsible urban planning must balance growth with ecological preservation through lawful and transparent practices.

Thank you for your attention and commitment to Auroville's shared vision.

NOTE RE MEETING SECRETARY AVFO AND MR KOSHY VARGHESE

Dear Community,

We would like to inform you that on Thursday, 27th February, at the invitation of Mr. Koshy Varghese, a group of residents (Alain B, Christine, Fred, Matthieu, Sauro, Tom and Valli) had a meeting in

their personal capacity with the Secretary of the Auroville Foundation, Dr Jayanti Ravi, the overall officer in charge, Dr Seetharaman, and the consultant for visa matters, Mr Koshy.

Although the meeting was called to hear about the February 3rd gathering about the PKS case, the conversation also touched on various topics of concern regarding the Auroville administration and their impact on the community, which has created a sense of fear and insecurity, and deep distress.

Brief summary:

- At the beginning of the meeting Mr Koshy, the convenor, emphasized the need for more communication. It was pointed out that the Working Committee of the RA and the IAC have sent many, many letters and reports to the AVFO and the Governing Board, bringing important concerns to their attention. These have not been answered or acknowledged.
- Questions were raised about the new internal visa procedures that have become cumbersome and invasive. It was expressed by the Aurovilians present that differences of opinion cannot be a criteria to disqualify someone for a visa. It was pointed out that the system of linking visa recommendations to payment of so-called 'back dues' of what is a voluntary contribution to the BCC is unjustified.
- The issue of the cutting of maintenances and means of livelihood, including for forest workers, as well as removing competent people from their workplace with no justification, was also raised. Those present said they will submit a list of people who have been affected by these actions so that these cases can be looked into.
- It was noted that building a city is not only a matter of infrastructure and physical development, it is an effort to create a new humanity through human unity and collaboration.
- Regarding development, those present were reminded that the community's initiative of building the crown road through participatory planning (Dreamweaving the Crown) was ignored despite this huge collective effort to produce proposals.
- Questions were raised about the residence criteria and concern was expressed at the attempt to change the Auroville Foundation Act either de facto through regulations and standing orders or through amendments. There was no response specific to these questions regarding the criteria, only mention of the need to follow architectural norms and financial regulations.
- The Secretary and the officers present indicated that they were open to look into some specific visa cases that might be brought to them, the concern over injustices these might represent, and reiterated the need to have more regular communication by the Foundation Office. Through Mr. Koshy, specific cases will be brought to the AVFO with the hope that there will be some positive movements.

After this interaction, we look forward to actions that might lead to further dialogue. Let us see what the future will bring.

MONTHLY TRANSPARENCY REPORT FEBRUARY 2025

Emergency Situation: FAMC Blocking Donations, Auroville Dog Shelter in Crisis

Following Cyclone Fengal, which destroyed the already deteriorated infrastructure of the shelter in December, a successful Donatekart fundraiser, supported by one of our partner organisations, "People for Animals," raised funds for essential repairs, food, and medicine for the Auroville Dog Shelter.

In late December, Donatekart transferred ₹11.5 lakhs to the Unity Fund after submitting all necessary documentation and signing an MoU to comply with government and AV regulations in terms of transparency and compliance. However, FAMC has blocked these funds for weeks, citing a nonexistent or non-updated Auroville policy regarding third-party donations, despite other Auroville units successfully receiving such donations for many years. FAMC's compliance officer, Margarita, falsely claimed the shelter had been the sole recipient of Donatekart/Milaap funds since February 2024. This is untrue, and Unity Fund confirmed that several other AV Units and activities have successfully fundraised through third-party platforms and received their donations through DCG. Only the Auroville Dog Shelter had been singled out and targeted in a discriminatory way.

During a meeting with high-level auditors, our executive and manager were informed that the FAMC's concerns regarding thirdparty donations are not specific to the Auroville Dog Shelter. The auditors clarified that FAMC needs to develop a comprehensive policy addressing the use of such platforms across all Auroville units and activities. They stated, "Raising funds through such portals have many issues, and this is an organizational decision to set up a suitable process and conditions for how fundraising will be done. As auditors, it is not for us to decide on these issues. We can only comment on appropriateness from compliance and control perspectives when a policy and process is put in place for the same. Accordingly, I am requesting that you take this up with FAMC or other appropriate level internally to determine on this." Essentially, the auditors emphasized that the responsibility for creating a clear policy lies with FAMC, and until such a policy is established, the Auroville Dog Shelter, along with all other units and activities that receive donations through third-party platforms like Milaap, Donatekart, Reach for the Stars, GoFundMe etc., remain in a state of uncertainty.

This blockage in crucial donations has plunged the shelter into a severe crisis.

With funds depleting in two weeks, we face imminent inability to provide food, medicine, or services, endangering the lives of our canine population and Auroville's safety. BCC only provides Rs. 50.000 per month, which is not even close to covering our monthly running costs of Rs 3.5 lakhs. A petition signed by 800 supporters to increase their funding has so far been ignored. The Auroville Dog Shelter was told by FAMC that they have to fundraise to survive. We did, but now FAMC is withholding the funds, which is causing the shelter to experience existential problems. This emergency situation, endangering the lives of animals in our care and the safety of AV residents and visitors, forces us to inform the Department of Animal Husbandry and the AWBI.



As a result of the decision by FAMC to halt our donations, we had to:

- Terminate half of our animal care staff, employing only half of the staff required according to the Animal Welfare Board of India
- Halt all sterilizations, jeopardizing our commitment to the Department of Animal Husbandry and our 1000-dog sterilization program.
- Become unable to pay a ₹1.3 lakh vaccination invoice which was due on 1. March, risking animal and human health as we are unable to vaccinate animals despite Auroville having been declared a rabies outbreak area.
- Stop all repair and upgrade work and dismiss all temporary workers and helpers. Due to a lack of building permission, we had purchased second-hand shipping containers and turned them into an urgently needed puppy house, a rescue, and an ABC kennel. This needed space extension cannot be completed due to the blockage of funds.

We urgently demand:

- Immediate release of the blocked funds.
- FAMC to develop clear, consistent policies for third-party donations, applicable to all Auroville units, in full compliance with Indian law and Auroville regulations.

The shelter's survival and the well-being of Auroville's dog population and the safety of residents, visitors, and guests are at stake.

Expenditures

- Animal Food: In February, we fed our dogs 1.7 tons of rice, 2 tons of chicken, and 600 eggs, supplemented with donated food items like vegetables and daal, which cost us approx. 1 lakh.
- *Staff Costs*: Total staff costs for this month for our workers paid animal care staff, 3 veterinarians (surgery team), and volunteers were approximately. 1.5 lakh
- *Medical Costs*: Medicines purchased in this month. Unpaid bill of Rs. 1.3 lakhs for medicines still open
- Infrastructure Improvements: We have almost completed our extension in the form of 3 containers. A detailed overview of the expenses will be published soon due to a lack of staff and time at the moment.

Project "Sterilising 1000 Dogs in 1 Year" - halted

Due to the blocking of our donations, we had to take the tough decision to halt all sterilisations for the time being as we are unable to pay our surgeons and purchase the necessary medicine. The Department of Animal Husbandry



has been informed about the seriousness of the situation the shelter is facing. We apologize for the problems this decision is causing and hope that the issue can be resolved soon so we can try to restart our sterilisation project.

Puppy Fair 2025

In a short note, we want to thank everyone for their immense contribution to make our annual "Puppy Fair" a sounding success. Several puppies and adult dogs have found new forever homes, and lots of animal care organisations, social media influencers, well-wishers, supporters, and animal lovers have enjoyed our event.

CHRONICLES OF DAWN

CHAPTER 6 - THE BINDING CIRCLE

In the early days of the City of Dawn, the wise ones had spoken of circles - but they spoke of them as living things, like the cycles of seasons, like the great round dance of stars above. They drew circles in the red earth, yes, but these were circles that breathed with the land, that followed the flow of water and wind, that made space for ancient trees and sacred groves.

Now a different kind of circle was being imposed upon the land the Perfect Circle, they called it. Seventeen measures wide, exactly the same at every point, cutting through forest and valley, garden and grove with geometric precision. Its architects spoke of unity and order, of bringing all parts of the city together. But those who looked deeper saw something else at work.

"Have you not heard the old tales?" the elders would ask. "Of other rings that promised power, that spoke of binding all things together? Have you forgotten how those tales ended?"

For they remembered something that the planners in their towers had forgotten - that true unity cannot be imposed from without, but must grow from within, like a tree reaching both up



to light and down to darkness, finding its own way to balance and harmony.

The Perfect Circle was more than just a road. It was a symbol of two vastly different ways of seeing the world - one that sought to impose order from above, and another that understood the wisdom of organic growth and natural flow. One that saw progress as a straight line forward, and another that saw it as a spiral dance of evolution.

In the archives of the City of Dawn, there were drawings from the early days - visions of a city that would grow like a galaxy, spiraling out from its center in patterns that echoed the sacred geometries found in nature. But these were living patterns, meant to evolve and adapt as the community grew in consciousness. They were never meant to be frozen into rigid forms.



Those who pushed for the Perfect Circle spoke of the future they could see from their towers of Mind. "See how it will connect all parts of the city," they said. "See how it will bring order to chaos." Their words carried the weight and authority of mental fixedness, backed by

the force of machines that could reshape the earth itself.

But others looked at the same plans and saw something different a kind of binding, a constraint upon the organic growth that had characterized the City of Dawn since its founding. They saw how the Perfect Circle would cut through places where the land itself suggested other paths, how it would divide communities that had grown together naturally, how it would impose rigidity upon a living ecosystem.

In quiet gatherings, some began to speak of deeper patterns at work - how throughout history, the straight line and the perfect circle had often been tools of control, imposing human will upon the organic complexity of nature. They remembered how the founders had spoken of a different kind of order - one that grew from within, that respected the wisdom written in the land itself.



"Look at how water flows," they would say, tracing the natural patterns in the earth. "Look at how trees grow, how communities form. There is order here, yes, but it is a living order, one that adapts and evolves."

Yet even as the Perfect Circle cast its shadow over their dreams, something unexpected began to stir in the community. The very threat to their organic way of life was pushing them to articulate more clearly what they were protecting - not just trees and buildings, but a different way of understanding progress itself.

They began to write and to articulate their voices - not just about the canopy and water flows that would be disrupted, but the wisdom that had guided their development for fifty years. They created maps showing how their communities had grown naturally along the contours of the land, how their paths followed ancient water flows, how their circles breathed with the rhythm of life itself.

As they contemplated the Perfect Circle, they found themselves not just questioning a road's design, but encountering a fundamental choice about human becoming - whether to impose perfection from without or allow it to emerge from within, whether to dominate nature's wisdom or learn to dance with it. This was no longer about urban planning but about humanity's next step.

And so, even as the shadow of the Perfect Circle grew longer, they held to their deeper knowing. They remembered the words of the Lady of Light, who had spoken not of imposed uniformity, but of unity arising through diversity, like a garden where many flowers bloom together. They remembered that their task was not just to build a city, but to discover a new way of living that the world desperately needed to learn.

For some circles are meant to bind, while others are meant to embrace. Some bring death through rigid perfection, while others bring life through organic wholeness.

The question was: which circle would they choose to serve?

PART 2 - THE "WORK" TREE: A MARTYRED BLESSING FOR THE EARTH



The Work Tree is a secondary pioneer. It grows in areas where the soil is exposed to the sunlight, but where there is nevertheless a modicum of top soil. It works the superficial layers of the soil and makes it biologically active thanks to the dynamism of its shallow root-systems and nitrogen fixing nodules. It does not get established where all the top soil has been washed away leaving the sub-soil exposed. In these conditions, the Silver Work Tree thrives, a primary pioneer. After the Silver Work Tree has grown for a couple of years, the improved soil enables the Work Tree to grow. After the Work tree has grown for a few years, the improved soil, the increased shade and moisture capital under its crown invite a large diversity of other species, both pioneers more advanced in the succession, and evergreens. And under its crown, its own seeds are not able to germinate effectively; they will only germinate beyond the drip-line of the tree. All of this is easily observable on the Auroville plateau, but not in forests where the steward is constantly interfering with the succession and removing plants and trees based on likes and dislikes. If the Work Tree is removed, the sunlight reaching the ground increases, and its seeds are able to germinate.

It does not have leaves but phyllodes, modified petioles, flattened and widened. That is what gives it extraordinary qualities in environments such as Auroville's where potential evapotranspiration is significantly higher than precipitation: they have an evergreen behavior because the phyllodes remain on the tree much longer than any other pioneer species in the same conditions. The result is the extra shade it creates during the summer compared to trees such as Teak, *Dalbergia, Careya* or *Albizia*, for example, so-called *natives*.

Looking at the big picture

If one zooms out a little and allows oneself to expand one's horizon, one realizes that many of the concepts one uses are impertinent and actually counter-productive, concepts such as

native or exotic, aggressive or invasive, alien or indigenous, pests or simply, bad plants:

- Flowering plants are 60 million years old. Their seed and pollen have been travelling the globe in the winds, in water and across land in a multitude of ways for periods of time which hugely predate even our earliest Homo forefathers. Plants were speciating and spreading across the entire earth well before our species came into existence and invented political boundaries, armies, flags, check-points and passports. They existed before we existed. Before our fateful advent and the psychological projection of our primitive nationalisms and racism onto plants, there were no borders. In fact, there are still no borders for plants. National borders have a reality only in the ego of man. They don't exist for the rest of the millions of living beings on Earth. A plant can only be considered a foreigner, an alien or an exotic if we project onto it our own latent racism or primitive nationalism and xenophobia. There are no native plants. There are no exotic plants. There are simply plants that live on Earth in conditions that are environmentally conducive to them at a given point in space and time.
- Ecology is dynamic. The distribution of flora is dynamic. The associations of plants are dynamic. Nothing is static in ecology. Because we live for such short periods of time and are mostly afraid of death, we cultivate a sense of security in squashing the enormously long time-frames of nature into years and decades, which are the units of time which make sense to our life-spans. Trees can live thousands of years.
- The terms native and exotic are senseless in ecology because they imply fixity of time and space. But as we have seen, ecology is intrinsically dynamic. If one considers a plant native, or exotic, then it is arbitrary and one must define both the unit of time and of space we are talking about:
- 1. For how long does a plant have to be found living within the arbitrary confines of a national border for it to become naturalized and given citizenship? Is the cut-off independence, or is it the tragic partition of Mother India? Or is it the first entrance into the peninsula of tribes from Africa? The Aryans? Or do we go farther back. Does a plant have to have been growing within the boundaries of India (2025 boundaries) since the last Ice Age? Or is a plant native only if it speciated where it is currently living? That is impossible to determine, anyway, as are all the above.
- 2. Where is the line drawn on the ground beyond which a plant becomes exotic? Where in space does a plant cease to be an illegal alien and become a naturalized native?

These terms, essential to define if one cares to make sense and be effective in our work, are never defined. If one chose the last glaciation as the cut-off, then the Neem Tree would be an exotic from Africa. There are species that are called native in many different countries. There are species that speciated in some regions and are now extinct there and are found only in other regions. Moreover, once upon a time, during Pangea, the continents were all connected. We therefore have the same genera of species in Asia, Africa, South America, Oceania, with species that are genetically very similar.

On its trajectory, work trees have been striped of their barks. This method, known as ring barking/girdling, disrupts the flow of nutrients and water to the trees, causing them to die slowly and painfully, and is sometimes used to clear and without cutting trees immediately.

More than a hundred miles to traverse, still... Shall we remain steady and still somewhere in us and smile on?

The altitude lures us to ascend that high. What attitude helps, in your experience?

I have grown old and known you not my love And now with mortal wound my soul must leave This earth, these men, this kingdom built on peace. Though you may weep awhile you shall not grieve


For you are his and now as I depart Sweet Lancelot, I give her to your care. How human love can tear the heart apart! I breathe my last this life no more to bear,






