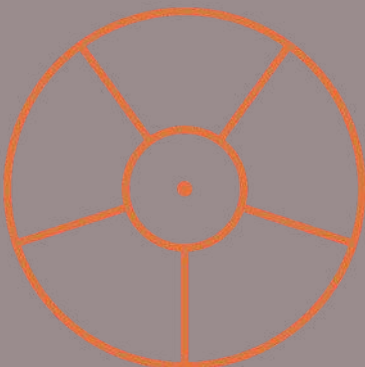
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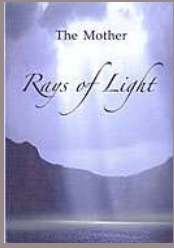
PONDERING

NOTE:

- A Newcomer becomes an 'Aurovilian' once his/her name has been confirmed by The Admission Committee (aka the Entry Board) after following due process.
- The date of becoming 'Aurovilian' is the date of confirmation. An Aurovilian confirmed by the Entry Board is eligible to participate in all community decision-making processes.
- The formal administrative step of entering new residents into the Register of Residents (RoR), is done by the Secretary of the Auroville Foundation. For this, a B-Form is filled in and signed by the individual and a meeting with the Secretary is arranged by the Entry Secretariat. However, until such time as the court has made its ruling about Admission and Termination Regulations 2023, the meetings of Confirmed Aurovilians with the Secretary will be pending.

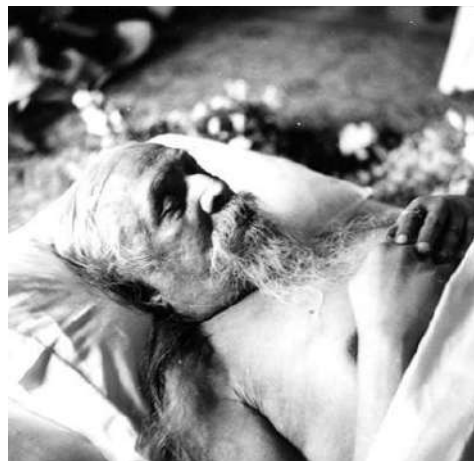

Reflections from collective readings

For the past month SAIER has been organising collective reading of *Mother's On Education*, on Saturday afternoons. You will find below notes and reflections which emerged from these readings and conversations:

The last two weeks were spent exploring the domain of Vital Education, the seat of enthusiasm, power, and enjoyment. We noted that although remarkable progress has been made in the mind and in technology throughout human history, the vital being has remained more or less the same, facing similar difficulties whenever we try to enlist its collaboration in the realization of our ideals.

The higher vital can aspire to what is beautiful and true, but it must be educated. Contact with beauty, heroism, or anything truly inspiring has a refining and ennobling action on it, kindling the aspiration to progress.

The search for satisfaction and pleasure is another area where it becomes possible to show that renouncing an immediate gratification can open the way to a greater, higher-quality satisfaction. These experiences have a real educative effect and allow us to avoid mere lecturing, which seldom works.

The teacher must of course work on their own vital; otherwise, they are not credible. It is always what we are that has the true impact, not what we say.

Rules can be used when they are clearly perceived as serving the shared aim of progress; and the best way to have them accepted is often to involve the children in formulating them.

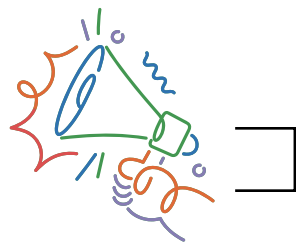
If we can obtain the joyful collaboration of the vital, we may find the way indicated by the Mother when she said: "It is the experience of life itself that must slowly work out rules as supple and vast as possible, so that they may always remain progressive."

From the start of December we will continue this exploration with 5 short chapters from *The Synthesis of Yoga*: "Introduction: The Conditions of the Synthesis"

These constitute a summary argument on why Sri Aurobindo finds it necessary to create a synthesis of yoga, on a new basis, which he will go on to present in the next 4 books. The first 3 books are built upon the trimarga of the Bhagavad Gita. The last, *The Yoga of Self Perfection*, is his own 'new' process! 'New' because the aim is transformation and not a withdrawal from life.

ABOUT THE AUROVILLE COUNCIL

The Auroville Council is continuing its work and will achieve its original purpose, as recommended by the previous Chairman, Sri Kireet Joshi.

Below is a selection of extracts from Kireet Joshi's 2003 talk on the Auroville Council.

AUROVILLE SELF GOVERNANCE - Talk by Sri Kireet JOSHI - 19 July 2003

Extracts:

"... The word 'self governance' is very dear to residents of Auroville, as it must be.

"... We have to study quite in detail and we have to study everything The Mother has said about this.

"... My second suggestion is that you should involve everybody, and there should be a decision taken by everybody that we are a collective.

"... The third step, I would suggest is that this **Auroville Council**

which has been constituted according to me very wisely—wisely because it was made by the will of the people of Auroville by suggesting one or two names whom they trusted most—so let us say, according to Auroville, the present members of the **Auroville Council** they are there as trustees, not as a public trust management committee, they are upholders of the trust of the people of Auroville. It's a sacredness.

“ ... So, consensus on the part of the members of the **Auroville Council**—this can be modified according to the circumstances—, a body of three persons as umpires, a study group, and discussions of parties who are not happy. And the task of the **Auroville Council** should be to see that good will is spread, harmony is spread, discipline is obtained.

“ ... According to me, if you put all this together, these elements and the parties in question which are in conflict and have dialog, real dialog at different stages, I personally feel a solution will emerge... and if everybody prays to the Divine: "We want to follow only the Divine's decision, not our decision".

WHEN PUBLIC LAND MEETS PRIVATE INTERESTS

Summary:

Over the past five years, the Auroville Foundation's Governing Board and Secretary have carried out a series of land exchanges to consolidate land within the Master Plan area. However, the processes behind these exchanges have not been clearly documented, raising understandable questions about legality, fairness, transparency, and whether principles of natural justice have been followed.

This essay explores whether the Governing Board and Secretary, **both appointed by the Central Government**, should be regarded as public authorities obligated to follow structured procedures under laws such as the RFCTLARR Act, 2013, when acquiring or exchanging land, or whether they may act more like private landowners. It also examines what "public purpose" means in the specific context of the Auroville Foundation Act, particularly when decisions affect residents' homes, stability, and long-term contribution.

A key concern addressed is the practice of granting or exchanging Auroville Foundation land to compensate private landowners, which appears to fall outside established statutory processes and may not reflect a clearly stated public purpose. These transactions also risk displacing long-standing residents without adequate notice, explanation, or alternatives, raising serious issues of natural justice.

Grounded in documents, statutory provisions, and publicly available information, the analysis highlights residents' basic expectations: to be informed, to be heard, to be treated consistently, and to receive reasoned decisions, especially when their homes or livelihoods are affected. It suggests that, as a community founded on transparency and shared purpose, Auroville should reasonably expect processes that uphold both the spirit of the Charter and the legal responsibilities of the Governing Board and the Secretary.

Ultimately, this essay is an invitation for clarity and verification. It asks whether current practices align with statutory obligations, public purpose, and the fairness needed for Auroville to evolve "without spokes in the wheel". While centred on land, the concerns reflect broader themes of governance, communication, economy, community processes and structures etc. all rooted in the shared aspiration that Auroville's development be both lawful and faithful to its founding vision.

Introduction

Over the past five years, the Governing Board and Secretary have been exchanging Auroville Foundation land to consolidate city land within the Master Plan area, aiming to build the city of the future. However, it has not been clear which process they have followed for this consolidation.

I have personally been researching and reflecting on this topic from a spiritual perspective, exploring possible out-of-the-box solutions. A related article I wrote, *"On land consolidation within the master plan area, an appeal to divinity beyond opinion,"* was published last year in *News and Notes (N°1046)*.

While those ideas were inspirational, an observation privately shared with me by other residents, I felt they did not have a reflective impact, as they were not pragmatic enough to address the immediate problem: arbitrary and unilateral decisions by the then Governing Board and Secretary. Consequently, I turned my attention to the legal system to seek clarity and out-of-the-box solutions.

With that in mind, I sought to understand how land acquisition and land exchange actually work when a government body, or a statutory body created by Parliament such as the Auroville Foundation, is involved. This was not a new area for me, as during my tenure as a member of the Working Committee selected by the Residents' Assembly (2014-2019), I have enthusiastically explored several questions that naturally emerged about what is lawful, appropriate, and fair.

Questions considered: Should the Auroville Foundation's Governing Board and Secretary, both appointed by the Central Government, be seen as functioning in a governmental capacity when acquiring or disposing of land, or could they act as private landowners?

Answer: Very likely, yes. The Governing Board and Secretary are treated as public authorities because they are appointed by the government.

Further question considered: More recently I have wondered whether they are expected to follow the structured processes outlined by the Indian government in the "Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Act, 2013" (RFCTLARR Act), for any form of land acquisition or exchange, or can they bypass those protections by framing actions as private negotiations?

Answer: No answer yet, but humour me and continue reading.



Auroville – Private or Public (within the Auroville Foundation Act)

My exploration naturally brought up the question of public purpose. The RFCTLARR Act, and all land-related decisions by public authorities, rest on the idea that actions must serve a genuine public interest.

In Indian law, "public purpose" is not casual. It justifies the extraordinary power of the State to acquire land. Under the RFCTLARR Act, public purpose must be explicit, documented, and connected to a genuine benefit for the public, not merely the preferences of an authority or the convenience of a project. It requires transparency, necessity, and proportionality.

Moreover, determination of public purpose cannot be one-sided. It must be tested against public consultation, social impact assessment, reasoned decision-making, and fair treatment of affected persons. If those who stand to lose the most, such as those directly affected, are excluded, the claim of public purpose or public interest becomes difficult to sustain.

Answer: I concluded that, yes, Auroville Foundation land, within the context of the Auroville Foundation Act, is intended to serve a public purpose. Moreover, within this context, “public” may reasonably be interpreted as referring to the Auroville community, including the Residents’ Assembly, rather than the broader population of India.

Therefore, it is logical to summarise that the Governing Board and Secretary, as public authorities responsible for managing public-interest assets such as Auroville Foundation land, are not above the processes outlined in the RFCTLARR Act. However, under section 46 of the RFCTLARR Act, they have discretion to decide whether an acquisition is compulsory or voluntary, which may allow them to engage in a negotiated arrangement with a private landowner.

Governing Board & Secretary’s Modus Operandi so far

From the land exchanges over the past five years, it is apparent that the Governing Board and Secretary have generally preferred private negotiations rather than compulsory land acquisition. However, when granting land to private owners, they have included existing Auroville Foundation land as part of the compensation. This approach warrants serious attention, as it appears inconsistent with the fiduciary duty of the Governing Board and Secretary to hold land for public purpose, not private.

Let us examine why this is very likely problematic.

Private Agreement Compensation

Unlike voluntary acquisitions under Section 46 of the RFCTLARR Act, the Governing Board cannot simply grant its land to a private party as form of private negotiated compensation without clear statutory authority. The land in question is not simply being acquired from a private owner; rather, it is being compensated by giving away land already held by the Auroville Foundation, whether purchased by the Auroville Foundation, purchased through earmarked private donations, or directly donated to the project for Auroville’s purposes.

Any disposal of such land is effectively a disposal of public property, which is very likely subject to strict statutory and fiduciary limits. Acting outside these limits may render such transactions legally void.

Public purpose: Every transfer of Auroville Foundation land must serve a legitimate public purpose or public benefit, rather than private enrichment.

- Philosophically and historically, Auroville was conceived as belonging to “humanity as a whole”, rooted in the Charter and acknowledged in parliamentary debates when the Act was passed.
- Legally, the Act vests control of Auroville’s assets in the Auroville Foundation “for further development of Auroville in accordance with its original Charter”, which connects statutory ownership to the Charter’s ideals, including the universality of Auroville’s belonging.

If the exchange primarily advantages a private individual while displacing long-standing residents, there is a strong argument that the transaction may be contrary to public interest. Courts and oversight authorities typically expect decisions affecting public or quasi-public land to be demonstrably aligned with the entity’s statutory mission, transparent, and justified in writing.

In reality, residents of Auroville have experienced nothing of the sort, when outside private buyers received valuable Auroville Foundation land through negotiated exchanges, while long-standing residents, whose names appear in the statutory Register of Residents, were asked to vacate without adequate notice, explanation, alternatives, or due process.

Since October 2025, the Governing Board has approved, and the Secretary has executed, three land-exchange deeds with private landowners for the stated purpose of consolidating city land.

Across the three 2025 land-exchange deeds, a pattern of inconsistent, irregular, and possibly unlawful valuation practices is emerging.

Case study, Eternity: The next proposed exchange concerns Eternity, the place I call home, along with the pioneering family that has faithfully stewarded and afforested this once-barren coastal land for over forty years, raising two generations. On the Friday morning of 14 November, we were called in by the Working Committee recognised by the Governing Board and informed that the Board has unilaterally decided to exchange all 18.5 acres of Eternity. We were told, plainly, that we are required to vacate. Whether or not we agree, it was implied that the decision “will go ahead” and will have to be “enforced”.

Given the manner in which recent land exchanges have taken place, leaving long-standing residents with no real choice, no fair compensation, and no meaningful recourse, this announcement came as a profound shock.

And beyond the likely ecological damage from a possibly illegal exchange of Eternity land, a more fundamental and humane question arises: What about our basic right to natural justice as long-term residents and caretakers of this land?

Natural Justice: A Guiding Principle

When we speak of fairness, it is often easiest to think in terms of natural justice, a principle so simple it feels like common sense, yet powerful enough to guide courts and public authorities across India.

At its core, natural justice asks:

- Have those affected been given a chance to know what is happening?
- Have they been given a chance to speak, raise concerns, or suggest alternatives?

These are not just procedural steps. They reflect a deeper commitment, that decisions affecting homes, livelihoods, or lives should be transparent, reasoned, and respectful.

Under the RFCTLARR Act, Indian citizens are entitled to notice, opportunity to object, consideration of objections, and written reasons for decisions. Even outside this Act, courts consistently emphasise that public authorities cannot act arbitrarily or opaquely when affecting property or residence.

For us in Auroville, natural justice offers a lens to reflect on the present situation:

- Were residents given sufficient notice?
- Were voices and objections genuinely considered before decisions were finalised?
- Are decisions explained clearly, with reasoning grounded in facts and the common good?

These questions are not accusations; they are tools to assess whether the processes being followed uphold fairness. Most residents will answer “no”.

So, here’s a reminder, to fellow residents and authorities:

Our Rights as Aurovilians: Residents have the right to be informed, to be heard, and to understand decisions affecting their homes, land, or livelihoods. Changes like relocations, land transfers, or evictions work best when communication is clear, input is welcomed, and actions are fair and consistent. Long-term residents can reasonably expect stability, alternatives, and notice before any disruption.

Responsibilities of the Governing Board & Secretary: The Governing Board and Secretary are entrusted with Auroville's land and resources, not as owners, but as caretakers for the community and humanity. Every decision, especially about land, works best when residents are informed, heard, and treated fairly, and when transparency and the Charter's vision guide the way.

Auroville Foundation land and fixed assets are not private property; they carry history, emotion, and responsibility, and ought always to be used with care for the long-term benefit of the community and humanity. Respecting these principles strengthens trust, preserves harmony, and helps Auroville thrive.

Closing Reflection

Reflecting on all of the above, I return to a simple truth, Auroville was founded on the vision that it belongs to humanity as a whole. Parliament acknowledged this when it created the Auroville Foundation and entrusted it with a public responsibility, to hold the land, resources, and future of Auroville in trust for the benefit of the community (the Residents' Assembly) and in alignment with the Charter.

With such a mandate, both the law and the spirit of Auroville expect that decisions touching people's homes, stability, livelihoods, or long-term contribution be carried out with transparency, fairness, and a clearly stated public purpose. Natural justice, the right to know, the right to be heard, and the right to understand decisions, is not a barrier to development. It is what makes development dignified, inclusive, and harmonious.

When authorities uphold these values, confidence grows, trust deepens, and the community can move forward together. When residents see that processes reflect both the law of the land and the values of the Charter, collaboration becomes easier, even in difficult moments.

As a resident, I am not asserting demands; I am voicing a simple, human expectation, that the processes shaping our collective experiment honour the principles India upholds and the universal vision the Mother set forth. The Auroville Foundation's unique mandate naturally calls for decisions that include rather than exclude, protect rather than unsettle, and reflect fiduciary responsibility, thereby strengthening harmony rather than eroding it.

In preparing this analysis, I have relied solely on verifiable facts drawn from publicly obtainable land-exchange documents, registered deeds, and government-recorded valuations. A brief overview is provided here to keep the focus on principles rather than technical detail. For anyone who wishes to review the underlying documents, calculations, or registration records in depth, I am happy to direct them in the right direction.

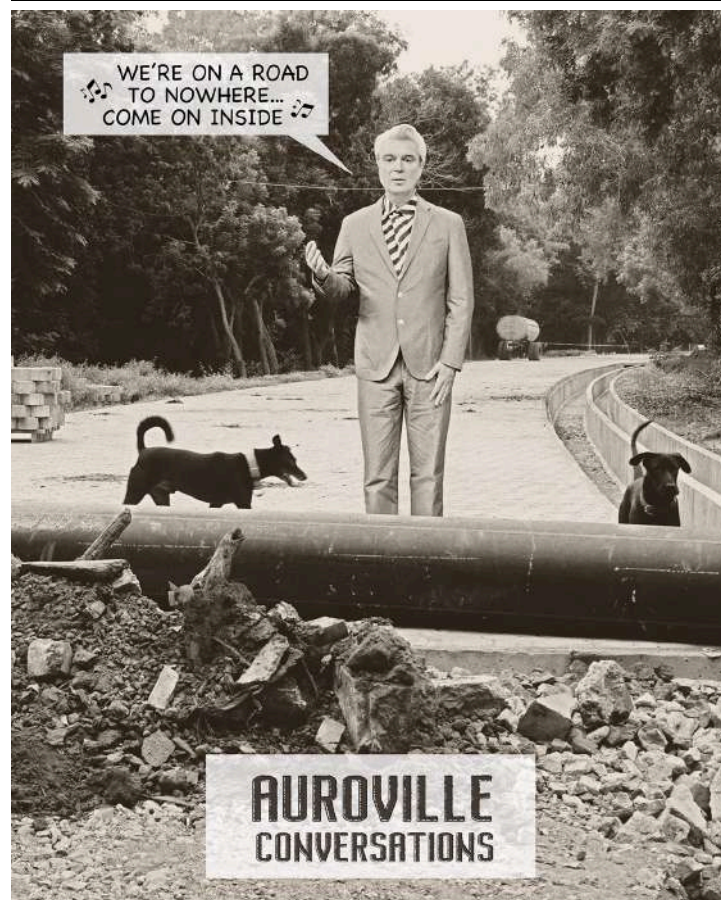
If any uncertainty remains about whether current practices align with these standards, then let this reflection serve as both an invitation and a gentle call for verification, clarity, and a renewed commitment to our Authority's statutory compliance, Auroville's public purpose within the context of the Auroville Foundation Act, and natural justice. Auroville's future depends not only on the land we build upon but on the integrity of the processes that shape our collective life and future evolution. Restoring alignment with both the law and the spirit of Auroville may be one of the most important steps toward restoring harmony today.

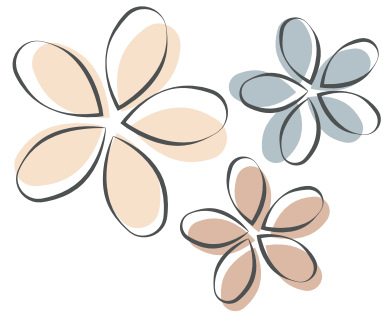

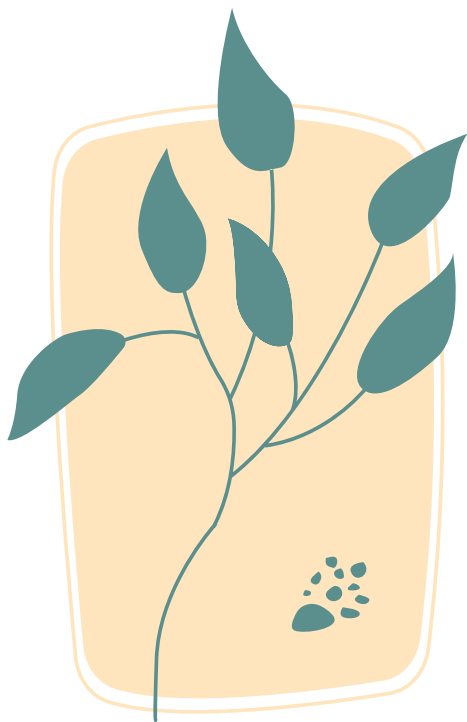

HEALING PRACTICES FOR TRAUMA FROM THE PERSPECTIVE OF INTEGRAL YOGA

WHAT IS TRAUMA?

In the light of Integral Yoga, trauma can be seen as a deep imprint left on our being by experiences that overwhelm our ability to assimilate, integrate, or respond harmoniously. More generally, trauma refers to the physical, psychological, and emotional response to deeply distressing or disturbing events that exceed a person's capacity to cope. It is the lasting impact of experiences that threaten one's safety, identity, or wellbeing, or that fall outside the range of typical human experience.

Causes of Trauma

Life events causing trauma may be personal or collective: sudden

shocks, long-term stress, abuse of power or authority, violence of any type (physical, emotional, or psychological), extreme pressure, painful relationships (personal or professional), political abuse, threats, displacement, loss of loved ones, loss of home or work, forced changes, witnessing violence, accidents, illness of oneself or others, diagnosis of a serious disease, and many other situations.

Healing Practices for Trauma from the Perspective of Integral Yoga

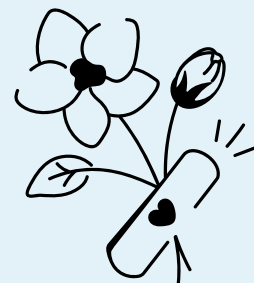
There are a few ways, inspired by Integral Yoga, to approach trauma with gentleness and the Mother's presence. These are not quick fixes, but steady movements of consciousness that invite healing and transformation over time.

#7 Quick Breathing Technique for Trauma relief

For high stress: sit or stand straight. Inhale naturally through the nose, then exhale fully through the mouth, emptying the lungs completely until the abdomen pushes out the last air.

Repeat three times for immediate calm.

There will be a healing practice shared each week in the News & Notes. This series is a weekly offering by an Aurovilian therapist, to help people to engage with their personal healing.

finally.

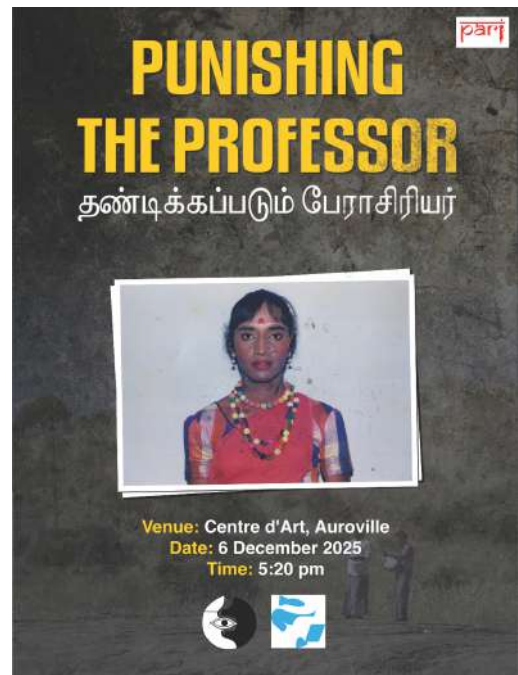

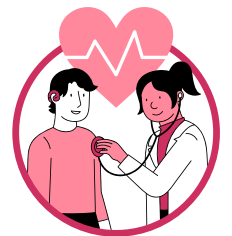

MONSOON WITH AYURVEDA AND LOCAL PLANTS



During monsoon, the climate is cold and humid, rains and little sunlight increase drastically the moisture in the air and on the ground leading to a more acidic environment, sour taste prevails. The body struggles to keep warm and dry, the digestive power can also be less.

VATA gets cold and gives joint pain, **PITTA** keeps fermenting, **KAPHA** bloats and retains water.

An extra focus will be given to Vata imbalances, as it is the right season to reduce or expel Vata toxins (in body: stiffness, bloating, coldness, pain and inflammation in the joints; in the mind: anxiety, anguish, fear, dismay, confusion, doubts).

This is a period to slow down and care for AGNI – digestive fire

IN THE FOOD :

- All meals are warm, cooked in a sauce-pan, easy to digest, light, spicy
- **Proteins:** Mung dal, beans, chickpeas, lentils (all of these cooked with asafetida to prevent bloating), white meat, egg, peanut
- **Vegetables:** amaranth, green leaves, carrot, beetroot, cauliflower, bitter-snake-bottlegourd, moringa (drumstick), chow-chow, radish, pumpkin – all should be well washed to avoid contamination
- Sweet taste with old grains - barley, rice, millet, oat, wheat
- **Fruits:** apple, pomegranate, banana, papaya, grape, guava, pear

- **Spices:** ginger, pepper, long pepper (pippali), turmeric, cumin, clove, asafoetida, mustard seeds, ajwain, cinnamon, fennel seeds, fenugreek seeds, onion, garlic
- Ghee or sesame/olive/sunflower oil (cold pressed)
- **Drinks:** herbal teas, warm or boiled water, with honey or jaggery
- **Ayurvedic formulas to take after meals:** Panchakola, Trikatu, Hingwashtak churna... with honey.

AVOID :

- All food with yeast/baking powder, cheese, yogurt, curd, lassi, beer
- Drinking too much liquid during or straight after meals
- Uncooked vegetables and salads
- Heavy and difficult to digest (fried food, pizza at dinner, etc)
- Milk coffee, ice cream
- Carbonated soft drinks.

IN ACTIVITIES :

- Be regular in the daily routine, especially in taking meals and going to bed
- Time to keep Vata balanced with Abhyanga (oil massage + steam bath), Shirodhara (warm oil on forehead), Basti (warm oil enema)
- Foot bath with warm salty water
- Wash with warm water (shower or bath)
- Keep body warm: neck and feet especially
- Soft physical exercise: 30 minutes a day
- Yoga, Pranayama, Meditation-concentration, Qi-Gong...
- Fumigation with eucalyptus, neem, sage
- Nasya (oil drops in the nose) with Anu Tailam at bedtime or in the morning to clear the sinuses.

AVOID :

- Siestas and day naps
- Intense physical sport or work
- Moist and cold air, wind, fan
- Staying humid after being in the rain
- Long hours in front of the computer
- Skipping meals or fasting
- Staying awake late at night
- Too many travels.



Most of the above aggravate Vata.

HERBS AND MEDICINAL PLANTS FOR THE RAINY SEASON :

- Moringa – Moringa Oleifera: to balance Vata and Kapha by increasing the digestive power
- Bhunimba (Nilavembu) – Andrographis paniculate: in feverish condition
- Guduchi (Giloy) – Tinospora cordifolia: natural immunoregulator
- Haritaki – Terminalia chebula with a little of rock salt: to balance Vata and ease bowel movement
- Dashamoolarishtam – for joint pain and inflammation, to balance Vata.
