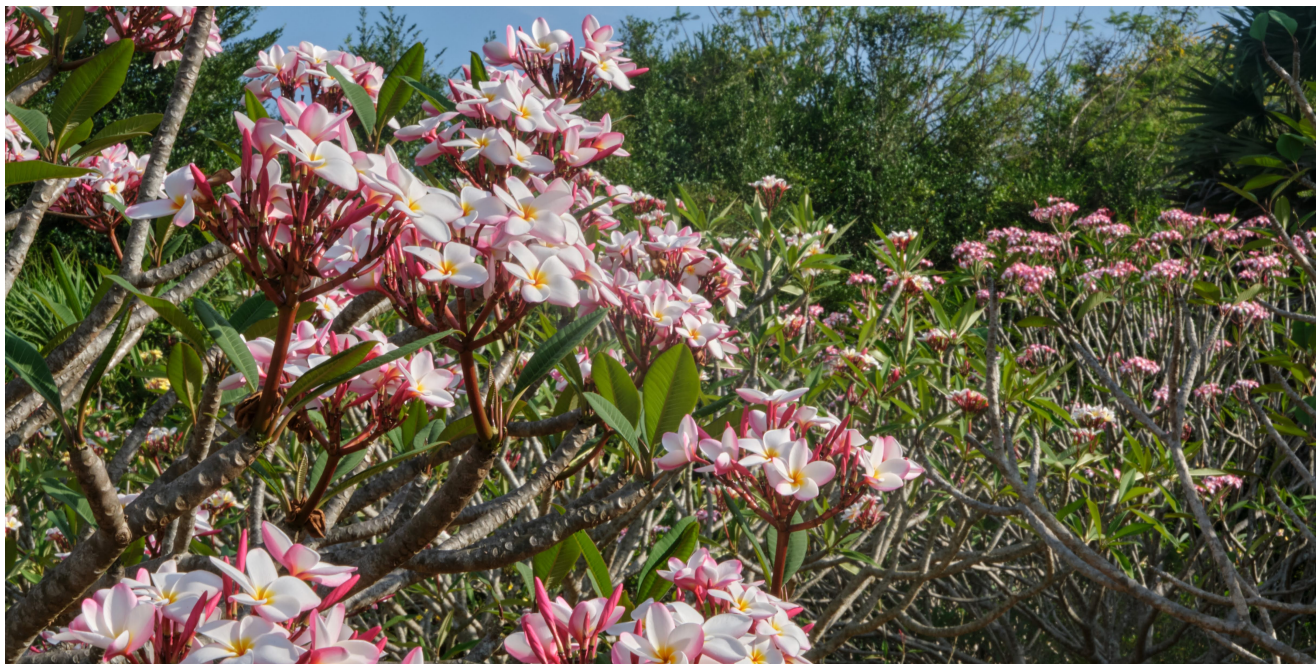

Two exhibitions: 'Auroville - An Experiment Under Threat' were held on 6 June in Chennai and 11-12 July in Pondicherry, with over 500 people in total attending both exhibitions.

The exhibition featured pictures of the destruction of Auroville's forests, roads, buildings and other assets, as well as an overview of the history of Auroville called 'From Dream to Nightmare'. It also included an immersive art installation titled 'The Room of Ignorance', which consisted of more than 40 unacknowledged reports which were sent by the RA TDC to the Governing Board. The reports were hung from the ceiling so that attendees could walk through them, whilst they walked over printed copies of the more than 150 emails sent by RA TDC which also never received a reply. The extended two-day exhibition in Pondicherry was well attended and featured new exhibits about the lease of Annapurna Farm to IIT Madras and the Dreamweaving process which took place in early 2022.





The exhibitions received [a response](#) from members of the AVFO ‘working groups’ who claimed that they “present[ed] a selective and one-sided narrative of recent developments in Auroville”, despite not having visited the exhibitions for themselves.

The organisers of the event stated “This exhibition was never about asking people to take sides. It was about making evidence accessible, inviting people to ask questions, and opening an informed conversation about what is at stake, not only for Auroville, but for any living experiment and future alternative that seek to serve humanity.”

Violence at Town Hall

On 13 May, a violent incident occurred in Town Hall in an altercation over the use of the Auroville Council Room. The room, which has been a site of contestation since 2022, has been shared relatively peaceably by the AVFO groups and the Light for Auroville Unity team (L4AU) since January 2026, when a rota for using the room was established. On the day in question, L4AU had booked the space between 10-11am, however at 10.45 Sindhuja, Antim, Muriel, and Sohini entered the room claiming that a meeting was scheduled for the AVFO 'FAMC'.

A [report](#) written by Aravinda, who was present, details that when Ashok explained that L4AU had booked the room, Antim became aggressive. As Muriel was already recording the events, Arun Ambathy decided to do the same, upon which [Antim took Arun's phone](#). A group of AVFO allies arrived at the scene, and Arun went up to Sindhuja and attempted to take her phone. According to [a report](#) shared by AVFO 'WCom' member Anu, Sindhuja claimed that he pulled her hair and punched her in the process. A clip of the [Council Room CCTV footage](#) that was released by the AVFO 'working groups' shows the chaos that ensued. It is possible to see Arun snatching at Sindhuja's phone, a subsequent scuffle in the corridor, and Joel hitting Arun over the head with a phone. For those interested in audio of the event, Arun's phone captures the moment when it is taken by Antim and continues to record the audio for about 10 minutes. This recording can be found [here](#).

Following the incident, the police filed FIRs against [24 people in total](#), which included 17 members of the AVFO administration. Subsequently, both Antim and Arun were arrested and were remanded in custody over the weekend by the magistrate.

Whilst Arun was in custody, the AVFO 'Housing Service' and AVFO 'Security Service' entered his house in Revelation, and [this interaction](#) was filmed by a resident. FIRs have now been filed against 10 AVFO 'working group' members for theft from Arun's house.

Since the incident, 'show cause' (SC) notices have been issued by AVFO 'ATSC' to all the L4AU members present in the room, threatening their Auroville resident status. Despite FIRs being filed on both sides, the 'SC' notices - issued by an AVFO 'working group' composed of some of those involved in the incident and subjected to FIRs- have only been given to the L4AU members.

The Town Hall is now only accessible via a single door, which is guarded by a security guard.



Several news items from different sources have followed after the incident:

Several responses from different groups have followed after the incident.

- 21 May: The Light for Unity Core Group sent out their own [report](#) on the matter.
- 23 May: The Auroville Council sent out a [massbulletin](#) in which they note that they have not used the room since March 2026, and that they condemn the violence;
- 23 May: Another [massbulletin](#) where the Council ask those involved to release all footage of the incident for review. This call has not yet been headed by the AVFO members.
- 23 May: The AVFO 'groups' condemn the incident via [massbulletin](#).
- 1 June: The AVFO 'groups' sent out a [massbulletin](#) placing blame on "the deeply harmful role played by parallel, self-styled, and self-proclaimed 'working groups'", asking the community to refuse them.
- 4 June: The L4AU team responded to this by [massbulletin](#), reminding the AVFO, among other things, that residents have the right to organize and participate.

AVFO launches Auroville TV channel

On 18 June 2022, the AVFO [announced](#) a partnership with [JioTV](#), one of India's leading streaming television services, and the subsequent creation of an Auroville TV channel, but no new developments were announced until recently. Four years later, at the end of June 2026, a select few Auroville residents received email requests by Uma Melin from Auroville TV, asking them if they would agree to give an interview. According to the mail, the channel would feature "programs on Auroville with interviews, workshops and documentaries". On 17 July, the AVFO held a public inauguration in Unity Pavilion for the launch of this Auroville TV channel, in presence of the Governor of Puducherry. The event was broadcasted live [on Youtube](#), and covered [in The Hindu](#) the following day. In recent years, The Hindu has covered most events organized by the AVFO, consistently republishing its press releases. One recent example can be [found here](#).

Leaflets and books removed from Visitors Center

On 16 July, Antim and Sindhuja of the AVFO 'working groups' removed all issues of [Auroville Today](#) and [La Revue d'Auroville](#), along with [The Spirit of Auroville](#) booklet from the Visitor's Center library. They also removed informational leaflets on Auroville produced by the previous teams. The reason provided is that these publications were considered as being part of the "old Auroville" rather than the "new Auroville" they are now building. *Auroville Today* will be replaced by the publication launched by the AVFO's media team, *Auroville Tomorrow*.

Other Updates and Information

Petition results

A [petition](#) demanding that Antim, Sindhuja, Joel, Muriel and Kaliananda resign from their posts received a total of 978 verified signatures (642 Auroville residents and 336 well-wishers).

Annapurna Farm update

Contract workers hired by IIT-Madras (IIT-M) arrived at Annapurna Farm on 16 June 2026, to fence off the 100 acres of land that had been leased to them (although the fencing work began only recently, in August). The land was leased to them for a [nominal 'fee' of rs 1](#) by the AVFO. The following day, a puja was held by IIT-M members.

A [subsequent communication](#) from the Annapurna team revealed that they had been hoping to open a channel for dialogue with IIT-M with a view to collaborate with them in some way. However attempts by the farm to communicate with the IIT-M team have been unsuccessful so far.

On 1 July, a group of residents and well-wishers of Auroville, including the [activist Piyush Manush](#), visited the IIT-M campus in Chennai to hand out two information leaflets about the lease of Annapurna Farm. You can find these leaflets [here](#) and [here](#).

In a parallel action, a [representation](#) to the Inspector General of Registrations in Chennai was submitted, to request an inquiry into the land lease. Specifically the representation raises questions about the rs 1 'fee' and whether the correct procedures had been followed and the correct duties paid. The representation also highlighted that the land survey numbers given in the MoU are materially different to those of Annapurna Farm - in fact the survey numbers in the MoU relate to land at Aurobrindivan, which was the original land earmarked for IIT-M.

This is one of six police complaints relating to conspiracy to defraud the State and Central Government in Auroville land exchanges that have been submitted in recent months.

Eternity update

On 10 July, members from the Secretary's office and Housing Service members visited Eternity unannounced, with police and a carpenter, in an attempt to change the locks and forcibly evict residents. Residents of Eternity met them at the gate, and asked them to show official paperwork such as an eviction notice. Neither the present members of the Secretary's office nor members of the 'working groups' were able to produce such a document.

After much discussion at the gate, the police eventually asked the delegation representing the Secretary (about 25 people) to leave as they didn't have an official notice.

The residents of Eternity, who have been ordered to leave and relocate to Courage in an order signed by the Secretary, continue to demand due process and accountability.

In an effort to protect themselves and the forest which has been carefully nurtured for over 40 years, they have filed a case in the District Court of Puducherry to "protect the residents from any attempts at eviction or interference outside the legal process". While this protection was granted, the Secretary's office responded with a statement noting that the protection "does not confer any right on the plaintiffs to continue occupying the Eternity premises beyond what is permissible in law." Miscellaneous news

- **New MoU between AVFO and NLC India Limited (NLCIL):** As covered [in the press](#), a new MoU was signed with NLCIL, a public sector enterprise under the Union Ministry of Coal, “for Electric Vehicles to Promote Green Mobility”. The terms of this MoU are not known to Auroville residents. According [to The Hindu](#), NLCIL provided “₹21 lakh for Auroville to procure four electric vehicles”.
- **Climate Change Summit:** Despite the ongoing destruction of the living environment of Auroville, and the lack of consciousness that has been present in the city development program since 2021, the [Young Indians \(YI\)](#) group held a [Climate Change Summit](#) in Auroville in June.
- **Controversies about the MM viewing point:** Increasing numbers of tourists are taking to social media (e.g see [here](#), [here](#) and [here](#)) to complain about the walk from the Visitors Centre to the MM viewing point. The walk, previously a short shaded pathway, was redesigned by the AVFO-installed VC team in 2023. Tourists are now forced to walk a reportedly 2-hour long route via Bharat Nivas, where there are a large number of stalls selling non-AV, plastic & religious items (please see [Bulletin 80](#) for more information).
- **Report on road building:** RA WCom member Prashant has released a report on the AVFO road building program in Auroville, titled ‘[The Concrete Disconnect](#)’.
- **New Auroville ID cards:** The AVFO released new Auroville [ID cards](#) with a QR code to improve “security at Auroville’s entry points”, which may result in increased difficulties for those not aligned with the AVFO to enter Auroville. According [to The Hindu](#), these ID cards were first distributed by the Governor of Tamil Nadu during a visit on 5th June.
- **Auroville name and symbol:** The AVFO released a [massbulletin](#) in which they condemned “the use of the name ‘Auroville’ on the website of a non-Auroville entity [... which] had been created by an Aurovilian”. They requested Aurovilians to refrain from using the name or symbol of Auroville “except where expressly authorised”. This opens questions around the use of the name of Auroville by registered institutions such as the AVI centers which are independent from the Foundation.
- **Residence Criteria court order:** The [court order](#) relating to the case brought against the Residence Criteria Standing Order was shared in June 2026 after a 3 month wait.
- **Visits of Indian officials continue:** Auroville has increasingly become a place of visit for Indian officials. Among others, the Governor of Tamil Nadu, the Lieutenant-Governor of Pondicherry or [State Forest Service trainees](#) have visited Auroville. These visits are usually unknown to residents, who learn about them thanks to The Hindu’s coverage.
- **Change of Education Minister:** In July 2026, following national protest events among Indian youth, the Union Government’s previous Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan resigned and was since replaced by Joshi Prahlad. The Auroville Foundation is under the authority of the Ministry of Education, so the effects of this change on the situation in Auroville remain to be seen.
